GOODS FOR NOTHING PROVIDES CLOTHING 'WITH LOVE' NOT A PRICE TAG

Goods For Nothing's mission is to provide Milton families with good-quality women's, children's and men's clothing and shoes for free.

The store is operated by the Southside Community Church in its lower level and originally started in 2009 as an outreach to women and children in transition who needed clothing, but didn't have the resources to purchase any.

"We wanted to give women a place where they could feel welcomed, valued and comfortable, while getting the clothes their families need," according to the church's website. "Shoppers can browse, choose what they need, knowing that we won't charge, so they can save their money for other living expenses."

CHRISTIAN BUSINESS GROUP FORMS NEW CHAPTER

Milton's Christian business community is creating a new chapter of the Canadian Christian Business Federation.

The inaugural meeting will take place on Friday, Jan. 25, at Cora Restaurant, 65 Ontario St. S., at 7:30 a.m.

Christian men and women involved in business or the professions - from those involved in real estate or insurance to business owners, CEOs and entrepreneurs - are invited to attend the breakfast meeting.

Canadian Christian Business Federation (CCBF) executive director Keith Knight describes the organization "like a Canadian Christian chamber of commerce." He reports that growth within the 35-year-old organization has been incredible over the past eight years. "We have grown from seven chapters seven years ago to more than 50 today, from Vancouver to P.E.I."

He says the national membership reflects a diversity of age and denominational affiliation. The new Milton chapter will hold free monthly breakfast meetings; the only

cost is the breakfast you order.

They generally last an hour and they're a place for business leaders to talk about business issues from a biblical perspective using a five-year curriculum of discussion materials. They deal with issues such as integrity, courage and risk-taking, team building, time management, power and influence, leadership, self-discipline, and conflict management. Knight will be the featured speaker at the inaugural meeting on Jan. 25.

"Our focus is primarily on leadership development. We aren't there to evangelize nor to network, though the networking and mutual support is a natural result of the meetings. We work in partnership with local churches."
