The announcement came during Family Doctor Week in Canada, which ran from Nov. 12 to 17, and is an opportunity to acknowledge the vital work family physicians do to Ontarians help keep healthy; this includes working in primary care, hospitals, home and community care, long-term care and public health, as well as in research and academia.

patients about him, they would describe him as "making you feel like you're being attended to by a friend with real concern about your problems" with "compassion beyond compare."

As a devoted lifelong learner and educator, Wa-

tada trains residents and students from the Rural Ontario Medical Program and is a peer assessor through the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario. After the hospital's Program Director position was discontinued, he organized speaking rounds

and course recertification for hospital staff. On his own initiative, Watada also educates colleagues on the trends he sees as a coroner - meeting with front-line workers and emergency department staff to inform them about fentanyl overdose guidelines, and with lab services to have fentanyl added to their toxicology screening.

"Dr. Watada's commitment to delivering compassionate care and sharing learnings so others can benefit has made him a beloved family physician in his community," said Dr. Glenn Brown, OCFP president. "Whether through

his own practice, in hospital or as a coroner, he has had a tremendous impact on his patients, peers and future generations of family doctors. It is a pleasure to acknowledge his contributions and achievements through this award."
