CHARGE LAID IN NEAR-FATAL E-BIKE CRASH

RIDER REMAINS HOSPITALIZED MORE THAN TWO MONTHS AFTER CRASH

A Burlington woman has been charged with dangerous driving causing bodily harm after a crash in Milton left an e-bike rider with critical injuries.

Halton Regional Police announced the charges late Monday, Oct. 28, more than two months after the Aug. 18 crash.

The collision occurred in the northbound lanes of Trafalgar Road north of Lower Base Line.

The subsequent investi-

gation by Halton Regional Police determined that a northbound Jeep Compass driven by a woman collided with the rear of an e-bike driven by a 35-year-old Mississauga man.

The rider was transported to Hamilton General Hospital in critical condition as a result of severe head trauma, where he remains with "life altering injuries," said Det. Const. Thien-An Vu of Halton police's Traffic Services Unit.

Haleigh Hutchinson, 25, is charged with dangerous driving causing bodily harm.

She will be back in court Dec. 16.


