



A revision of the Tariff in such way as to relieve from taxation as much as possible the necessaries of life, which enter into the consumption of the whole

A uniform Currency for the whole The reduction of Postage on Letters

to a uniform rate of Three Cents, and the abolition of Postage on Newspapers. The enlargement of the St. Lawrence Canals, so soon as the finances of the Dominion will permit, and the construction of the Intercolonial Railway by means of a subsidy to an independent Company rather then as a Government

The opening up of the North west, and the immediate establishment there of a strong system of Government, calculated to promote the settlement of that magnificent country, and to ensure the safety and contentment of the Settl-

The adeption of such measures as may be necessary to bring into Confederation the other Portions of the British American Possessions, so that the whole of these Colonies may be united under one Government, and a great and powerful British American Confederacy be thus built up.

The promotion of Immigration to the country by the adoption of measures calculated to attract the Emigrant and Capitalist from the Old World to settle

amongst us. The organization of the Departmental System of the Government on an economical and efficient basis, and the passage of such measures as will prevent any Administration from expending money without the previous consent of Parlia-

Recognizing the great services of our Volunteers and the alacrity with which they responded to the call of duty in the hour of public danger, it will be my pleasant care to see that any reforms desired by them are carried out, and that all necessary steps be taken to give permanency and efficiency to the patriotic volunteer movement, in which I have always felt the warmest interest.

Should you have such confidence in me as to place me at the head of the Polls at the coming contest you may always rely upon my best energy being devoted to promote the interests of the Dominion of Canada.
