Thinning Fruit.

This is a process which is needful to keep trees in full bearing vigour year after year. An over-abundant crop exhausts. It is not much trouble to thin out fruit, but people hesitate to do it because it seems like so much dead loss. But this is a mistake. It is better to have a moderate yield every year than an excessive crop one year in three. Not only does thinning out fruit promote regular productiveness in an orchard, but it secures larger and finer fruit. Fewer specimens, better in quality and bigger in size, are preferable to a great lot of inferior and under-sized fruit. Severe thinning wonderfully improves some kinds of fruit that are naturally diminutive in size. The Seckle pear is an example in fruit. Knowing ones who have exhibition honors in view, well understand the value of this thinning out process in producing the first samples of fruit, and practise accordingly .-- Ontario




