

The buyers goes and makes his select. ious at the prevailing price for that day, lie then puts his purchases into wicker baskets holding about 200 lbs each and takes it home. The next it is kneaded or worked by muchinery, which is simply a process of washing in clear spring water, to get the butter-milk and other impurities the groughly extracted; it is to 200 lbs. butter, and again washed so as to liquify the salt, and put with
