President Smith of the \$4000. Chamber of Commerce was the first witness. He stated that last year one firm shiped \$2,-000,000 worth of cotton to the Orient by way of the Canadian Pacific road and by English steamers. Of this Oriental trade he thought the Canadian road carried last year about 90 per cent. Mr. Smith thought that some consideration was given by the road to secure this trade. The Canadian roads, he said, are constantly increasing the amount of their trafic between New England and Chicago to the detriment of American roads. The foreign roads he held should be put on

an equal footing with our own. Then we can fairly compete with the Canadian J. H. Heinck, chairman of the Committee on Interstate Commerce of the New York Produce Exchange, said that during certain months of the year the Eric Canal acts as a regulator in the railroads. If it were not for the Canadian roads it would do the regulat-If the Canadian roads were shut out of the country it would bring a great additional amount of trade to New York and Philadelphia but the rest of the country would suffer. But the Canadian roads should be under the same conditions as the
