The Export of Wheat. I fancy, however, there is quite as much money in raising wheat in Manitoba at 75 or 80 cents. There is a regular procession of wheat trains day and night between Winnipeg and Fort William. At Port Arthur the C.P.R. has an elevator of 800,000 bushels, used principally for cleaning smutty grain, but Por Arthur is on the whole rather dull. Fort William is the active receiving and shipping point. There are three elevators c 1,200,000 bushels each and a new one 1,500,000 is being built. The wharves a the mouth of the Kaministiquia are lined with vessels unloading coal and loading grain. A few years ago a lake vessel that could carry 50,000 bushels American steamers like the "Carnegie" take over 180,000 out of Fort William to Buffalo. The "going rate" all summer to Buffalo has been a cent and a quarter per bushel. It is now 2 1-8 cents and may be three or four before the season closes.
