Toronto Man Dies in British Columbia From Cold and Injuries. Nelson, B.C., Jan. 5. - In an inquest held into the death of Albert Ashton. in which Ashton was used roughly. Kelthan and Ashton then left Whitewater. but Ashton, owing to his injuries, was unable to keep up to his companion, and lay down by the wayside. The jury returned a verdict "that Albert Ashton came to his death through exposure, aggravated by an assault on his person by at or near the Victoria Hotel, Whitewater. Boreen was arrested on the charge that he "did unlawfully kill and Slay one Albert Ashton." His examination was adjourned and bail fixed at \$12,000. Ashton comes from Toronto,
