herring, and besides its great size, strength and gameness it is remarkable for its enormous scales, some of those from a fish Dewar's Block. Harness-making across. Over the greater part of the body the exposed portion of the scales is covered with an epidermis which resembles frosted silver, while the back of the fish is green and beautifully iridescent. 




