The best way to kill Canada thistles when there are only a few plants is to dig a small bole around the stem of the thistle and fill it with strong salt brine, then pull the thistle up. This must be repeated as often as any thistles appear above the ground. A little watchfulness is necessary. If there are too many to be treated in the above manner, they can be cut with a sharp hoe lust beneath the surface. This must also be repeated as often as they appear. In pasture lots they can yery easily be killed by salting the cattle on the spots where the thistles are.
