The bowls were, of course, easily taken from their hiding places under cover of the shawl, the india rubber cover being removed beneath the cloth before the bowl was exposed to the

The trick was a very effective one and rarely failed to elicit a round of applause, curred which not only spoiled the trick, but also resulted in the complete discomfiture of Herrmann.
