Times says: Well-deserved condemnaupon those members of the Chicago Irish-American Ambulance corps who went to the Transvaal nominally for tore the Red Cross badges from their arms and started in to fight the British. Thirty-three of these fellows returned the other day to the land they had disacceiving the contempt they had earned. they were cheered and dined by people with as little regard for honesty and decency as themselves. The corps was more than 100 square miles. made up of six physicians, one professional nurse, and 51 men who were supposed to be litter-carriers. Before leaving this country each of the 58 went before a justice of the peace and made Africa not as an ally of the Boers, bu as an ambulance man, and each pledged himself not to fight. Miss Clara Barton gave the corps a Red Cross flag and recognised the organisation as a Red Cross auxiliary. Every one of them, therefore, that took up arms was guilty of gross and wilful perjury, and to the extent of his power decreased the respect and confidence of all nations the Red Cross society. The Medica Record gladly notes that none of the six doctors violated his oath, and that the one real nuise was equally scrupul ous. It also says that the committee appointed to receive the warriors treated them with great coldness and reproached them for perjuring themselves. If this last is so it must have been done very quietly, while the congratulations the wretches received were public and vociferous. Every feature of the episode is deplorable, and it is hard to av the suspicion that the Red Cross officials were less careful than they should have been in lending the use of their names to an organisation that made no secret of what it intended to do as soon as it was safely through the British fines."


