





have well-fitting covers, but not airtight ones, and should be about three times the height of the diameter. The sketch is so simple that it scarcely needs explination. One point to be be kept in mind is to see that the cans are not set too deep in mainy weather as the water may rise and overturn the milk. Snaps are used on the ends of the rope to attach the can, as seen in Fig. 1. The cover of the case is so made that when closed it slants back



to seed rain. The front piece is detachalle and sets in so that when closed it can be locked with a pail h. The well may also be used in a substitute for a cool cellar or an box. Our cut (No. 2) shows a plan which articles of food that it is sired to preserve cool may be lower ! down the well. A tin pail wit ... cover is used for this purpose It needless to say that, in all cases, utensils used in this connection w. _ the well should be perfectly clean.

What The Creamery Business Needs. Better cows and more of them. more for them to eat, and better care with better bulls and more clover. Educate the patron to be a reasonable and sensible being. Let farmers patronize each creamery more largely, especially during the winter months, for by running to its full capacity the year round operating expenses will be reduced, and it can pay a larger proportion of the receipts for butter to the producer. Continue advocating the keeping of the very best cream cows that can be get, to feed more and better grain and to enter into farming with more businesslike methods. Too much cream is made in

May and June when butter is very

low, which reduces the yearly returns.

Willard, in the Rural New I Yorker, states that nothing is better for covering the bruises on trees than oil shellac with, perhaps, a little flower of sulphur and a few drops of carboling acid, which last ingredient should be used very sparingly. The mixture can be applied with a paint brush. Pertilizer for Hoed Crops. The large amount of labor requires in cultivating hoed crops, makes it all the more important that they should be pushed forward as rapidly as possible, and also in ways that will not lessen the moisture in the scil. For this reason the concentrated feri tilizers containing available nitrogen are preferable to stable manure. There is always in coarse manure a great amount of vegetable matter, which will only rot when the soil is wet, Under the furrow this manure holds op the soil, creating air spaces which dry out both the manure and soil so that the manure will not rot. Th commercial fertilizer furnishes nitrogen without making the soil dryer This often means with a noed crop the difference between failure and success.

The Peanut Peanuts can be raised in the North as well as in the South. They thrive best on light, sandy soil. Northern growers claim that they do not fill out well, but this difficulty may be lessenod by applying lime to the soil in th. autumn before planting. Even an ap-- plication of lime at this season, befor planting the seed, will be found o.
