Orchard Cultivation

There is a danger that on account of the wet weather, orchards will not receive their usual cultivation. which is urgently needed to destroy weeds, aerate the soil, and conserve soil moisture for future use. If the ground is not stirred it bakes, cracks open and evaporation goes on rapidly. By stirring the soil through frequent cultivation, thus keeping a loose mulch on the surface, capillarity is broken up and moisture retained. As soon as it is possible, therefore, to get on the ground after a rain, the cultivators should be started in the orchard and kept going as steadily as time and weather will permit.




