



Hook climbers are equipped with J hooks, which are caught up in the surrounding vegetation. Root climbers, like ivy, throw out fibers along their stems and ascend slowly, insinuating themselves by means of rootlets, which grow away from the light and become glued to the stems of trees or to harder surfaces. 




