In the Question Drawer of the August number of the Municipal World a correspondent asks whether a grant by a certain town council of \$30 for the travelling expenses of a delegation sent to Ottawa to ask for a grant from the Government was legal. The answer is "1. Section 596 of The Consolidated Municipal Act, 1903, applies only to the councils of the cities therein mentioned Section 597, which authorises grants of \$500 and under to be made by towns of \$5,000 or over, and other municipalities of not over \$100, does not empower the council to make grants to pay travelling ' expenses. 
