BEES GOOD FOR FRUIT

study if bees are injurious to fruit has ported that bees, from their instincts, the conformation, function and movements of their mandibles, as well as from the shape and consist ency of the other mouthparts, cannot perforate the skin of fruit, and it is only incidentally that they lick and suck the juice exuding from fruits which have been injured by other natural causes. The injuries to orchards and vineyards sometimes attributed to bees are due to poultry, wild birds. wind and hall, and most frequently to hornets, wasps, vine-moths, and other insects. The destruction of hornets and wasps is recommended; it is easily effected, because their nests can be found without difficulty. Bees do not injure grapes or other fruit even indirectly; on the contrary. they are beneficial to them, either by bringing about the cross-pollination of the flowers, and hence the setting of the fruit, or any promoting the dessication of damaged fruits from which they absorb the juice and pulp, thus preventing fermentation and rot extending to sound individuals (this la especially the case with grapes) The orchards and vineyards fre

An expert horticulturist writes With young trees we should do very little winter pruning, and that we should direct the growth largely by summer pruning. The work to be most effective should be done a little each year, and at just about the time the tree completes its annual growth, which in this section is about the first week in July. It done too early it will debeat its aim and pro duce a strong growth of shoots. It done too late it forces out a soft growth which is likely to be winter

should be to direct the growth and later to induce fruitfulness. Only strong growing trees should be prun ed during the growing season, re membering that it is a devitalizing operation and may easily be over done. With regard to bearing apple trees the necessity for summer prun ing is less pronounced if not entirely eliminated. Since our mature trees tend to overbear, there is no neces sity for inducing fruitfulness, and winter pruning would therefore be the most logical practice.

BETTER BUTTER PAYS

Farmer Holds Key To Quality And

The farmer holds the key to the quality of the butter manufactured and the price received for the same. The market price of butter is gov. erned primarily by its quality. Good butter which brings top market prices brocery can be made only from good cream, and the quality of the cream in turn and the quality of the cream in turn is controlled by the care it receives on the farm. Under modern market conditions the quality of butter affects its price more than ever before. i.e., the difference in price between first grade butter and second grade butter is very great. This fact is due largely to the increase of imports of foreign butter, made possible by the reduced tariff. Most of this imported butter is of good quality. This influx of foreign butter will be vastly great er. In order to successfully meet this competition with foreign butter, and to preserve Canadian markets for Canadian butter, we must produce better butter; we must produce a butter equal in quality to that of the im-

Its influence upon the tree in many respects is opposite to winter pruning. The latter stimulates wood growth, while the former tends to lessen wood growth. As a rule, any practice that checks wood growth tends to induce fruitful-

hess. Growers have taken advantage of this fact for many years. In Eng land the result is obtained by root pruning. The method consists in digging a trench around the tree at some considerable distance and severing
