

score years, give hint that the country has left the pioneer stage behind. It is not long since every soldier of prominence in Canada was a native of the Old Country. Sir William Ofter was the first native Canadian to become head of the General Staff at Ottawa, and now we have a Canadian Commandment of the Royal Military College, in the person of General Sir Archibald Macdonnell. Sir William Otter has indeed become an institution in the Canadian military service. 
