The esproduction per acre was 400. 1 the continuated gross returns were \$103.45. Corn Flakes, Bran and 1 and the net profit per acre was \$20.45. It will be noted that the returns per acre from flax grown in Untario were very much higher than at Kentville, Nova Scotia, but the growing conditions in western Ontario were exceptionally favorable last year and the yield of fibre and seed per acre obtained has not been equalled for many years. Furthermore, the Ontario flax was handled throughout by experienced help, whereas at Kentville prac-, tically all the work was done by inexperienced labor. Nevertheless, the net profit of \$20.45 per acre, which was obtained at Kentville, is very satisfac-

tory when compared with that receively. ed from other farm crops. During the war there was much attention drawn to the growing of flax or Canada, but flax. like many other products, suffered considerable depres products, suffered considerable depres sion during the years following. Since the autum of 1923 the demand for flax fibre has gradually been improving. This is, no doubt, due to the falling of in Russian production and to shortage of raw cotton. In view o. the fact that there is likely to be a world shortage of both flax and cotton for sometime, it would seem that flax might be produced profitably in certain sections of Canada. Successful cultivation depends largely upon the rainfall during the growing season. The soil requirements are very similar, to those of any other grain crop, only; it is most important to have the seed, sown on clean land.

Use Single Stamps.

The postal department has issued a poster asking patrons, wherever possible, to use a single postage stamp on a letter, parcel or other piece of mail. because in some instances the use of more stamps may so encroach on the space for address, and date-stamping as to cause confusion and consequent delay in the mail.



30,000 Pounds of Seed. A scheme for the tree culture and reforestation in Ontario has been undertaken by the Department of Lands and Forests. The department planted burnt over and cut timber land with pine seed during the fall of 1924, but as this was more or less in the nature of an experiment in Ontario, only three or four hundred acres of land were planted. Approximately 30,000 pounds of red and white pine seed were used for the production of seedlings for reforestation purposes.

The seeds, in the form of the familiar pine cone, are taken to an extraction plant, one bushel of cone | ed in New Brunswick. producing one pound of seed when treated. Each pound of seed contains about 30,000 individual seeds, which, according to experiments carried out by the department, should produce lifteen to twenty thousand seedling plants.
