

THE TURNSTONE.

Have Short, Pointed Bills, Stocky Red Legs, and Stout Bodies. Turnstones differ in some respects from all other shore birds. They have short, pointed bills, stocky red legs, and stout bodies—a combination which enables them to perform stunts unknown to shore birds generally, writes J. Townson, nature correspondent of the Toronto Globe. The birds derive their name "turnstone" from their singular habits of turning over the flat stones along the beach for the purpose of securing the small crustaceans concealed under them Although, as a rule, they are rather shy, and do not invite close inspection, the writer was permitted to approach within twenty yards of a few of these birds before they took wing when they flew only a short distance before alighting again on the beach Perhasps they were tired and hungi after an all-night flight by the air-lin
