The sugar loaf has gone, but the name remains. We still ask for "loaf" sugar. Incidentally, it was a British firm—then Henry Tate & Sons which gave us, and the world, 1876, sugar in the handy form of

The raw sugar, looking like a dark, sticky, crystalline mass, arrives in bags from cane-growing countries, and goes through a multitude of operations at the refinery, writes a Tit-Bits man. Weighing and the taking of samples for analysis come first. Then the raw sugar is washed by being mixed with water or a speciallyprepared syrup until it attains a certain consistency. The mixture, or "magma," thus,

formed is maintained at moderate heat, to be passed by ducts into machines which contain tub-shaped "baskets" of finely-perforated metal. utside is a stationary casing. The "baskets," electrically driven, are revolved, and each is then filled with 15 hundredweight of the "magma," and the latter is driven by centrifugal force up the sides of the baskets, for equal distribution.

For some minutes the baskets are revolved at high speed, and the syrup or water which was added to the raw sugar, together with the low-grade syrup adhering to the crystals, is carried through the basket-perforations to a trough, and thence to a storage tank. Hot water is sprayed over the sugar, but, although now free from dark syrup, it is still far from white, and contains impurities. The next operation is to melt it by

steam jets. Then it is treated with a filtering medium, pumped through a filter-press, and emerges as a bright amber-colored fluid. The only impurities remaining are soluble salts. and organic coloring matter. are removed by animal made from specially - selected bones The sugar liquor is run on to the top of a charcoal-filled cistern, and flows out at the bottom a white, colorless;

The next operation is boiling. Enormous vacuum pans are used, some turning out twenty tons of sugar at a single boiling. Each pan has stout glass windows, known as "eyeglasses," so that the pansman can watch the progress of the boiling. The mixture, for cube sugar, then run, into circular machines where it sets in slab-form, THE NORTHERN SHRIKE frames, convenient for handling.
