Results of the experiments have caused scientists to announce that there is something in the life-giving belief of the Hindus. It is said that there are millions of bacteria in the water, which are able to attack and kill germs of a large number of diseases. The bacteria are so small that scientists had trouble locating them. It is thought that cultures of them may be obtained which will be used in fighting diseases.

RELAGIOUS SECT BANS RADIOS Bringing the extremely strict tenets of their creed up to date, the Amish Mennonite conference of Ontario decreed that radios must be banned from all Amish Mennonite homes, the sect classifying radios with musical instruments which have been barred since the sect was founded. Musical instruments, along with many other modern luxuries and even some so-called conveniences, are banned from the homes of Amish Mennonites, as being instruments of the devil, designed to lead the faithful away from devout worship of the Almighty. Penalty for violation of the ban on radios in the home is excommunication from the church.
