## THE CANADIAN CLUB

"TOWERVIEW FARM"--Who will be the first farmer in the Hornby district to name his farm "Towerview Farm"? A picture of the new 150 ft. radiating tower on the eighth line, east of Hornby, appears on the fourth page of this issue of THE CHAMPION. The picture shows you what the tower will look like when completed.

When Dr. J. Leslie King, of Galt, appeared as guest speaker at the meeting of the Canadian Club last Friday evening, a host of old friends were present to welcome and renew old acquaintances with the former Miltonian. The speaker was introduced by Mr. C. E. Dawson, the President of the Club, at whose request Dr. King had consented to show the beautiful moving pictures taken during a visit to England and the Continent. The first reel showed glimpses of activity on shipboard between the time of departure from Montreal and arrival at Southampton. On the promenade deck could be seen the Prime Minister of the Dominion and other distinguished Canadians during periods of relaxation. Upon arrival in England and dignitaries boarded the ship to extend formal greetings to the visiting Canadians. Being a devotee of wild life, Dr. King spent considerable time at the zoo and saw the pictures of polar bears, and lady penguin and other animals and birds were a source of education to the audience. The climax of the evening came when Dr. King presented the dazzling manner in which old London had dressed itself for the occasion. So that darkness would mar the grandeur, floodlight and search lights were strung to present a fairly outline for a number of warships. Through the colored moving pictures a new conception and unprecedented view of the coronation. The club members were afforded an intimacy with the cheering throngs and a close view of a polychrome pageant of regal pomp and circumstance on the ornate state coach drawn by eight Windsor greys. In addition to the coronation, Dr. King presented a Kodak film obtained from the King and Queen along the coronation route and gave the audience an opportunity of seeing close at hand the actual coronation ceremony. A "closing ceremony" was shown of the King and Queen with their two charming daughters and Queen Mary on the balcony at Buckingham where all could see the prodigious beauty of the flowering Rhododendron and the views of the Chelsea Flower Show displayed a gorgeous exhibit of roses and other flowers in the most perfect of color. Following the coronation scene the club was taken as an accompanying boat passenger with the Doctor up the busy, colorful Rhine, past fields of grapes and crumpling castles standing on precipitous cliffs. The ship glided slowly past the historic Lorelei rock and Bingen, a city made known to the public school pupil by the old Third Reading Lucerne in Switzerland, set amid the towering snow capped Alps. In concluding his presentation of the coronation, not only as a glorious pageant, but as a sacred, impressive dedication. As a witness to the procession the Doctor said that as the wide throng swelled with uncontrollable emotion, in the realization that passing before their eyes were the beloved King and Queen, who had unselfishly fulfilled their duty in preserving the Crown for Great Britain.
