> Reports of game experts tell natural breeding places of birds and animals, the nests, eggs, and even which so many game fish are found become too warm when the forest On cover is destroyed. Trees tend to ing the water and prevent th stream bed and surrounding ground from absorbing the heat of the sun during the day. Furthermore, the lye in wood ashes dissolved in the streams destroys the aquatic life upon which fish feed.

Forest fires eventually affect the floor of lakes and streams as much as the forest floor. There is less control of run-off water when the forest cover disappears, so that wa ter levels rise and fall more rapidly Both tend to destroy the aquation plants and smaller animals on which fish depend for food.

"Forests," says the forest service, "furnish three essentials of wildlife; food, breeding grounds, and protection. Green forests mean wildlife. Forest fires mean destruc-


