TEACHER SAYS NO FEAR IS SHOWN

"The British will win this war because people with their indomitable courage and cheer could never go down defeated," is the conviction brought back from England this week by Miss Ann Campbell, household economics instructor, whose home is near Milton.

An exchange teacher in Cambridge Technical college, Cambridgehire, England, she left Canada last September on the Empress of Australia, just five hours before war was declared. She is a graduate of the University of Toronto, and will teach in Toronto this term.

"The people of the British Isles are an admirably strong, calm race. If they know fear, they certainly do not show it—and this includes the school children, whom one might expect to be afraid," Miss Campbell told a reporter last night.

One of this teacher's most vivid recollections is that of watching a recent duel between a huge German bomber and an English anti-aircraft unit. The objective was a prominent Cambridgehire city, where Miss Campbell was residing. "I went out that night to see the bomber acting like a gigantic bird," she related. "It shone like silver in the play of the searchlights. I could see the spurts of flame as English tracer bullets whipped through the machine. Then the plane came spinning to earth, bursting into a wall of flame as it landed.

"Nine people were killed that night, the bomber dropping aerial torpedoes directly over the city. German aviators are dreadfully poor marksmen, and reports reaching Canada that most German bombs fall in open fields are no exaggeration. Sometimes they manage to hit the suburbs of a city by aiming at the centre, but generally not."

"The ace English airman speak very highly of our Canadian flyers," said Miss Campbell in her treatise on bear continuous comment over there, such as "The Canadians are doing wonderful work and deserve praise."

"The economics teacher learned to feel the approach of a German machine from that of an allied plane every time." She explains there is "an unmistakable fluctuating hum" to the German plane engine, which is synchronized and smooth in the British hum." She relates that when the hum was heard and bombs began falling, we heard and saw the line for the car crashed on the first line, resulting in damage estimated at \$200. Steel, the driver, said he swung sharply when he met a car at a turn on the first line. The vehicle plunged into the ditch and rolled over twice.
