No foliage whatever will appear this fall. Next spring, however, a sizable amount of leaves will develop. They will die before hot summer weather arrives. Toward the end unless the most advanced of August the spindly stems will again emerge, and will again be topped with flowers. Peculiarly, colchicum do not bear foliage and flow-


