

Small Crop For Ontario Indicated

Although the recent rains will be of considerable benefit to roots, pastures and the late-planted grains, the drought during the early part of the summer has created a serious situation throughout the agricultural industry in the Province and the indications are that the crop, as a whole, will be one of the smallest in years.

This showed the situation to be serious, and last week the Department of Agriculture instructed all agricultural representatives to make a close survey of the estimated yields for the hay and grain crops, so that definite information could be secured for the purpose of determining the department's policy.

The recent survey shows there will be a reduction in the estimated yield for oats of from 20 to 25 per cent from the normal, and that barley will be down 25 per cent, and wheat about 35.

The Minister declined to make any deductions from the report, preferring to study it as it is, and that it will be one of the shortest crops in years and agreed that the situation was serious and would necessitate action of some kind.
