

NEW RURAL MAIL BOX RULES

Due to the increasing danger of traffic accidents, it is proposed to revise the regulations of Rural Mail Delivery Boxes. The new regulations will read as follows:

"All rural mail boxes must be erected on the right-hand side of the road, based on the direction of travel followed by the rural mail carrier in serving the route. They must be erected in such a manner as to not interfere with highway traffic, highway maintenance operations, or snow removal, while at the same time permitting the carrier to serve them without dismounting from his vehicle.
