Modern Pied Piper Needs More Than Pretty Tune

You're tossing \$1.80 down the sewer every time you let a rat live... for that's the yearly cost of feeding a rat. This startling fact is disclosed in an article in Coronet which declares that the modern Pied Piper needs more than a pretty tune to bring the rats from their holes.

One of the biggest difficulties in fighting a rat war, says Coronet, is to convince people it isn't only the poor in the slums who have rats. The rich have them too; perhaps fatter, fatter rats, but they have them, and most people don't realize the amount of harm a rat can do.

Under the new system, a registration number remains with a car throughout its existence. The law creating this system provides that any time within three months prior to expiration of the period for which a vehicle is registered, the registration may be renewed for an additional six months or one year.

Most modern rugs and carpeting will not fade except under direct exposure to sunlight because manufacturers use fast dyes which will last as long as the rug. When customers complain about light rugs fading in color it often happens that the rug has actually become so filled with dust that it seems grayish and faded.

Naturally good rugs should be good care. Don't just put them on the floor and forget them. Use adequate rug pads under them. Turn them every few months so they won't wear in spots where traffic is heavy or heavy pieces of furniture have set. Don't beat the rugs violently. It is likely to break or loosen the fabric.

Medical authority today has reversed the age-old decision that frostbitten ears, cheeks and fingers should be rubbed with snow. Condemning the fact that rubbing with snow or even ice frequently is used as a first aid measure in cases of frostbite, the current issue of Michigan Public Health corroborated the findings of top-flight medical authority by recommending the use of body heat to renew circulation.

"Use of the warm hand or other sources of body heat has long been recognized by physicians as the proper treatment," the journal stated editorially. "Yet," it said, "the old popular notion of rubbing with snow or even with ice persists."

Australians Are Among World's Bashful People

The name Australia means "South Land" or "Land of the South." Among the six continents it was last to be reached by white men. Three hundred and thirty-six years ago, a Spaniard named De Torres passed near the northern coast of Australia, but it seemed that no landing was made.

A few months later a number of Dutch sailors went ashore in Australia, but they were met by natives who rushed to attack them. The sailors went back to their ship, then sailed on.

Other Dutch vessels visited the continent in later years and for a time it was known as "New Holland." The Dutch, however, did not care much for either the climate or the people. They were more interested in the islands of the East Indies.

An English sea captain, William Dampier, visited Australia in 1688. Exactly 100 years later a party of British colonists came and settled there. They were followed by many others, and at the present time the population is just about 7,000,000.

Buyer should look for a number of things in judging the quality of a rug. A good backing increases the serviceability of rug or carpeting. To test the quality of the backing, grasp it in your hands and feel it. Note whether it seems firm instead of limp.

In a pile rug examine the density of the pile—that is, the number of tufts per square inch and the length of the pile. Bend the rug over your hand and notice how thick the pile is.

Watchmaker in Steel Plant Watchmaker in a steel plant, his familiar eye-piece, delicate tools and tiny lathe in strange contrast to the roaring furnaces and thundering rolling mills, is G. B. McGarvey, who works in a small room in one corner of the vast J & L Seamless Tube Mills. He replaces broken hair-springs, worn bearings, and makes delicate adjustments, not to watches, but to precision gauges that contain jeweled bearings, hair-springs, and other fine parts. These gauges are used by inspectors in tube mills for examining the pitch, taper and depths of threads on each end of all seamless oil country pipe and couplings produced in the J & L mills. Measurements of gauges must be accurate to one-tenth thousandth of an inch.

Pruning Rambler roses reveals the considerable amount of new growth that is being sent up from the crowns of the plants. Checking this with your earlier season experience will show that this year's flowers were produced on the new canes of wood which grew from the clumps last year. A close examination will reveal that few if any blooms were born on the wood which developed season before last.

Pruning cuttings from the plants, the good gardener prunes out all of the two-year-old wood on his rambler roses and from which last year's growth has been removed without greatly changing the shape of the plant.

The SNAPSHOT GUILD

ANIMAL SNAPSHOTS Farm animals and pets at home offer excellent subject matter for the amateur photographer. Story-telling shots like this are easily obtained with a simple box camera, of the type thousands of us possess.

MANY camera-hobbyists do not have access to zoos, so lack the opportunity to picture wild animals, but there are two other groups—pets at home or domestic animals on the farm—that are available to almost everyone. And, I believe that they are just as interesting, and maybe better, for picture purposes.

Most of our homes have pets and a good collection of pictures is always in order because dogs and cats have definite personalities which can be portrayed with the camera. Often a picture-story of a puppy—telling of his daily life and activities—is about as interesting as a similar picture-story of a person. Children usually are fond of pets, and as they play together or merely pose, the amateur photographer has a splendid chance to get many appealing snapshots.

Around the farm, there are dozens of opportunities for really fine animal pictures. Consider, for example, a herd of cows homeward bound from pasture, work horses plowing fields or hauling a load of harvested grain, or sheep grazing on the hillside. And don't forget farm fowl—a hen mothering her brood of chickens, a rooster perched high on a fence post, or the proud turkey as he struts around the yard. All these are photographic material of the finest order.

Keep your eyes open for incidents that will give a story-telling flavor to your snapshots. Watch for the dignified ducks as they parade to the pond, or for horses standing with their heads together as if in deep conversation, sheep being sheared, or the little farm girl with her pet lamb. For humor plus appeal, try a few shots of a long eared donkey or mule, or six or seven little pigs "at dinner." You don't need special camera equipment for good animal photographs. All you really must have is an observant eye and a willingness to wait until the best pose or expression occurs. Start a picture-story of pets and animals. Such a collection will make a fascinating album, well worth your time and effort.
