Weekly War Commentary

On Luzon Island in the Philippines, American armored units were speeding toward Calumpit, only 25 air miles from Manila, early this week. San Fernando, second city of Luzon, fell to the Americans after brief resistance.

Russians Nearing Stettin

Back on the European front, the Russians have driven to within 57 miles of the Baltic port of Stettin and the Germans admitted the fall of Posen could only be a matter of hours. The Nazi radio was addressing frantic calls to German citizens to save their capital as the Russians had saved Moscow when Nazi forces were at its gates. Another German broadcast said the high command was considering the withdrawal of certain contingents from the Italian front to compensate for Eastern front losses. Field Marshall Kesselring in Italy demanded the mobilization of all citizens in northern Italy from 18 to 60 years of age.

In Western Europe, American third army troops were fighting on German soil at the starting point of the enemy's costly December breakthrough into the Ardennes sector of Belgium. The Germans reported that the Canadians were attacking 14 miles northwest of Tilburg. Allied troop movements were also noted by the enemy in the Hurtgen Forest area southeast of Aachen.

Between the arms of the United Nations' nutcracker on the eastern and western fronts, the Reich was also suffering from a continued aerial battering. Refugee-packed Berlin was bombed two nights running by heavy R.A.F. bombers. Seven German rail centres and a tank factory were objectives of daylight aerial attacks in the same period.
