At His first coming He was rejected by them, as was brethren. His father was to dwell in the best of the land (v. 10; ch. 47: 6), but that was not the best part of the message; the sweetest word was "Thou shalt be near unto me" (Phil. 1: 23; Jno. 14: 3; 1 Thes. 4: 17). Joseph was to be their nourisher (v. 11; Ps. 23. 1; Rev. 7: 17). Communion follows reconciliation.


