LESS WOOL PRODUCED

a reduction of 625,000 pounds from the 1945 output. The reduction was attributable to a decline in shorn wool production which was 802,000 pounds below that of 1945.

The domestic disappearance wool in Canada in 1946 amounted to 112.6 million pounds as against 67.2 million pounds in 1945. The large increase was due to importation of slightly over 100 million pounds

(greasy basis) of wool. Gross income from shorn wool in 1946 amounted to \$3,801,000, compared with \$4,015,000 in 1945. Likewool in 1946 declined to \$3,460,000 from the 1945 level of \$3,656,000.
