## Irreplaceable

A young engineer was detailed as technical observer for a 24-hour test of pulverized coal in a big heat and power plant. The installation was temporary, and the fuel (almost as explosive as gunpowder) was stacked in cement bags around the boiler room. Along about midnight one of the stokers looked about cautiously, then lit his pipe.

"Hey," shouted the engineer, pointing frantically to one of many red warning placards, "you can't do that. This stuff's dangerous."

The stoker eyed him disgustedly. "What do you care," he grunted. "You ain't responsible."

Any one of the 500 hotel men who have just met under the auspices of the National Fire Prevention Association will see in this story a familiar problem and a lesson. They have gathered to discuss ways and means of insuring that there will be no repetition of the ghastly conflagrations which marked the year 1946. They have drawn up the basis of a model safety statute which they will ask all State legislatures to adopt. Its provisions look sensible and practical.

But unless such statutes are administered through frequent, honest inspections, and enforced by officials with some courage and alertness; unless hotel employees from manager to hall porter—and guests, toomaintain a continuing sense of responsibility for the safety of themselves and theirs, then the best laws ever enacted, the best mechanical







