BRITAIN'S HARVEST ABOVE AVERAGE THIS YEAR

A report issued on October 11th by the Ministry of Agriculture shows this year's harvest is at least 25% better than last year's despite the storms in August and early yield is now anticipated to be 19.9 ten-year average of 18.7.
