One item which everyone ducks in Ottawa, says The Financial Post, is an explanation of why the federal surplus is again soaring into the stratosphere without regard to Finance Minister Abbott's official estimates.

Estimates of the number of livestock on farms in Canada at June 1st, 1948, compiled by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics indicate a decrease for each of the principal kinds of farm animals as compared with the numbers at June 1, 1947. Hogs estimated at 4,463,100 were 18.5 per cent below last year. Cattle numbers at 9,470,300 had declined 2.6 per cent. There was, however, no significant change in the number of cows and heifers two years old and over kept mainly for milking purposes. Slight increases
