Trafalgar Council Selects Constable

Selected from 15 applicants, Constable Harry Wilson of the Oakville detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police was named a police constable of Trafalgar Township at the meeting of township council on February 17. He will receive a starting salary of \$2900 a year. A. E. McKay applied for permission to construct a swimming-pool on the Lakeshore highway west of Oakville. He was instructed to canvass property owners in the neighbourhood to obtain their opinions on the subject. Council approved the application of D. Morris for a permit to build a motel on the Dundas highway near the Sixth Line. Trafalgar Public Utilities Commission wrote informing council that the \$50,000 provided in the annual budget was inadequate and a sum of \$115,000 was needed. The letter stated that a billing machine which is to be purchased cost \$5,000 alone. A draft by-law embodying restrictions for the area in south-east Trafalgar just south of the industrial area was presented by D. A. McCopachie, the township solicitor. It was forwarded to S. Stratton representing ratepayers in the district, for examination. Council authorized the public school board to appoint a member to sit in on the meetings of the North Trafalgar Planning Board. The clerk was authorized to turn over to Gore and Storrie all tenders on water mains and sewers advertised on February 7 for them to select the best bid. The construction of a watermain as a local improvement on Burten Road and Orchard Drive was approved and the by-law sent to the municipal board for their approval. Oakville Transportation Co. was granted permission to drive over township roads. A by-law to authorize the construction of a water main as a local improvement on the 9th Line in the township of Trafalgar was passed and also forwarded.
