

Born In Milton, Bank Manager Dies

Funeral service was held on Saturday, April 5 in Toronto for Harold Everett Wales, who died at his home in Islington on April 3. Mr. Wales was born in Milton 52 years ago, and was manager of the Kingsway branch of the Bank of Nova Scotia. He had been ill for several months.

He joined the staff of the Bank of Nova Scotia 37 years ago and

served in branches in Petrolia, St. Catharines, London, Chesterfield, Cornwall and Peterborough.

Mr. Wales was a former treasurer of the Kingsway Kiwanis club and the Kingsway Businessmen's Association. He was on the board of stewards of the Kingsway-Lambton United Church and was a member of the Masonic order.

Besides his widow, the former Jean McLaughlan, he is survived by one son, Lieut. Gordon Wales, RCN, Halifax and one daughter, Mary Jean Wales.
