Report Deer Dead Denied By Warden

Dudley Hitchcox, Halton game warden, has denied a widely spread report heard on the radio and printed in several papers that he had found deer dead of starvation near Milton. "I found a few that dogs had killed," he was later reported as saying. "There were two or three I had to shoot myself because they were in poor shape—skinny and weak and able to run only 15 or 20 yards at a time."

He believes the large herd in Halton will face starvation next winter if they are not thinned out. He is reported as advocating an open season. "There just isn't enough food left to support any more deer in the county. There are marshes where the deer feed, but they have been browsed out to as far as the deer can reach."

Halton Breeders Export To Italy

Twenty-seven local breeders contributed to one of the largest shipments of pure bred Holsteins ever exported from Canada by boat to Italy. It included 350 choice heifer calves and two high class bull calves. These animals were intended as foundation stock for the herd of Holsteins maintained by Count Gaetano Marzotta at Portogruaro. Included were replacements for the 41 head burned to death when the plane carrying them crashed at Pisa last January.

More than ordinary interest is attached to this shipment, since it is the first lot of Holsteins to leave Canada since the imposition of the foot and mouth disease embargo.

The calves were purchased from the leading herds of Ontario and Quebec by Tom Hays and Albert Stagg of Oakville, Ont. All were required to meet stringent requirements, these including an average production on the three nearest tested dams of at least 16,000 lbs. milk on a mature three-times-a-day milking basis. They were also carefully selected for good blood lines and type. After inspecting them, George M. Clements of the Holstein-Friesian Association of Canada reported that "they are a high class lot and many of them would have been strong contenders at the shows this year had they remained in Canada."

NYLON FUR

Early this year Canada's Defence Research Board announced that a Canadian Government Agency had applied for patents on synthetic furs made from nylon. The "furs", first developed for the RCAF in 1949, imitate mink, beaver and muskrat. They are said to be of any desired texture, capable of being dyed any color. Washable in soap and water, they are almost impossible to wear out.
