

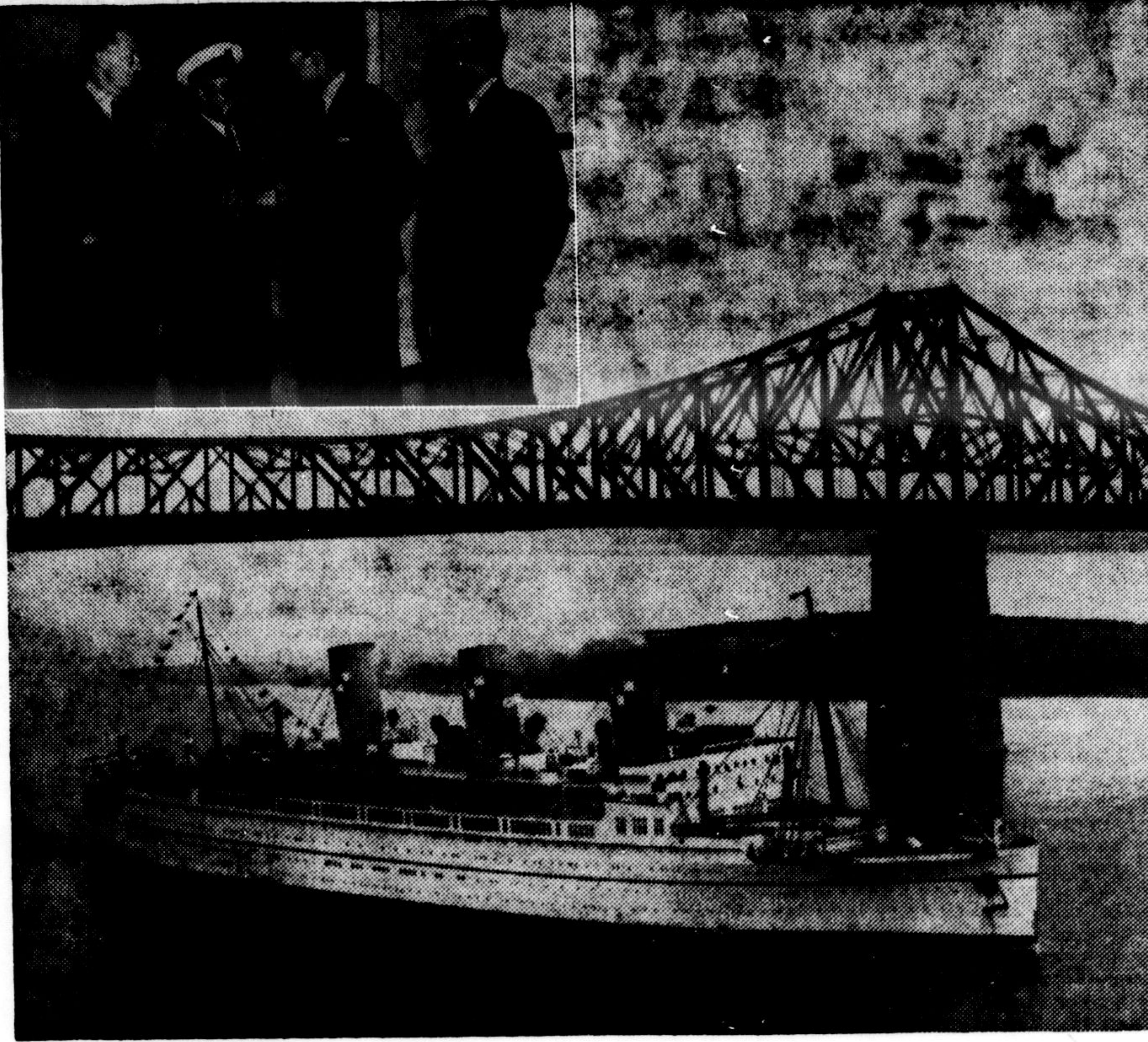
**CAMPBELLVILLE LOSES FIRST**

**THE EMPRESS OF SCOTLAND**, 26,300-ton flag ship of the Canadian Pacific fleet is shown here passing under the Jacques Cartier Bridge at the entrance to Montreal harbor to make history as the largest vessel ever to arrive in the world's largest inland port. The big luxury liner and cruise ship, which had to have her masts shortened by almost 45 feet to clear under the bridges and power lines on the way up-river from Quebec, will make Montreal her Canadian terminal for the remainder of the 1952 St. Lawrence navigation season. The 666-foot long vessel carries 663 passengers, and will make one trip every three weeks between Liverpool, England, Greenock, Scotland, and Montreal. The inset shows Capt. C. E. Duggan (in uniform), master of the largest and fastest vessel on the St. Lawrence route, being welcomed to Montreal by Capt. J. P. **Two Drinks Impair Driving Test Shows**

A series of road tests conducted with 37 skilled drivers, aged 20 to 45, proved that the amount of whiskey in two highballs "caused a deterioration of 25 to 30 per cent. in the driving performance of expert drivers." Dr. Leonard Goldberg, of the Carlene Institute of Sweden, conducted the tests to prove or disprove the claim of many motorists that they "can drive better after two or three drinks." More startling evidence comes, the article says, from Motorforarna, a Swedish Insurance Co. writing "traffic insurance" solely for non-drinking motorists. Motorforarna has been in business 18 years, now has over 7,000 policyholders. Its record over 14 years compared with other Swedish companies indicated that Motorforarna had to pay in losses per vehicle 38 per cent. less than the average of the other companies. The number of claims per 100 vehicles was 37 per cent. less. Since by no means all the policyholders in these other companies were drinking drivers, alcohol played a tremendous difference in creating the difference between the two groups. Elephants, alligators, turtles and poll parrots have an average life span of 100 years or more.



Hello Homemakers! It's not the time nor the grime that we mind during the housecleaning spree, it's that exhausted feeling. This is usually true of those who are doing so much work by hand. When you think of it, work with a whisk and hand polishers is a lot more laborious than letting the vacuum cleaner and electric polisher do an excellent cleaning job. Full use of these electric appliances is the secret of short cuts in spotless housekeeping. By the way you may be able to purchase the attachments for models you have bought as single units. The wall brush, upholstery brush, crevice tool and demoting sprayer are of special use. And you clean the extra brushes by passing them over the open end of the bare wand while the machine is still turned on. Be sure the dust container or bag is emptied often — your vacuum won't work efficiently if it's dirty. Most vacuum cleaners and all the polishers do not have to be oiled or greased. So it's up to you to keep the machine clean.

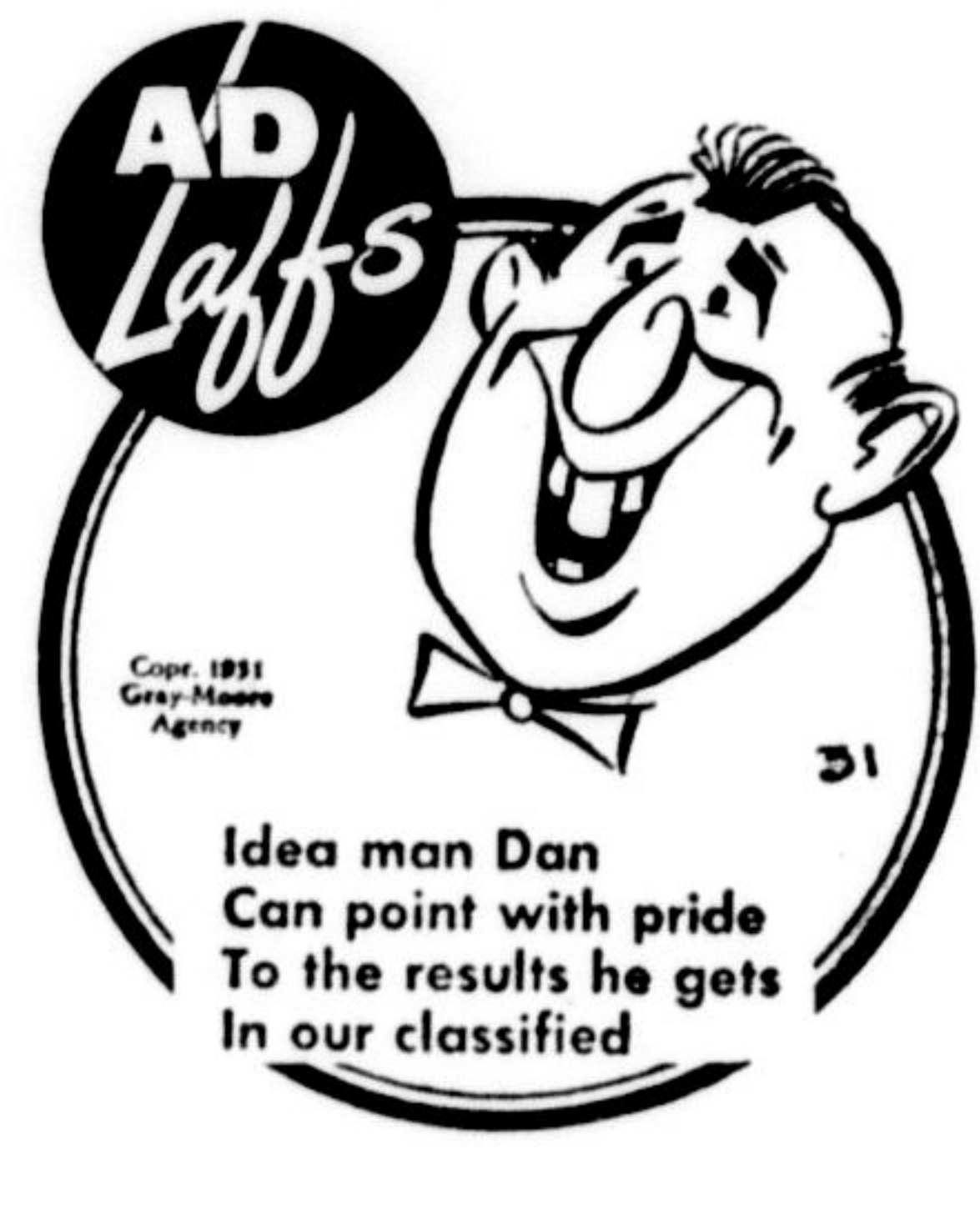
- TAKE A TIP**
1. Hold the nozzle of the bagless vacuum cleaner and the brush attachments firmly in position without applying pressure.
  2. Dispose of one part of the connecting tube for the vacuum cleaner when you are dusting chairs. It will be more convenient.
  3. Don't forget that the vacuum cleaner should not be permitted to pick up pins, tacks and sharp objects that may pierce the tube or bag.
  4. Make sure the thin coating of wax has been applied twenty minutes before you begin polishing.
  5. To clean the brushes of the polisher, clean with wax remover or carbon tetrachloride.
  6. Dust that collects behind the wheel of the electric polishers is readily brushed off by removing the screw plate.
  7. To clean the vacuum cleaner you may take it to the back door, plug at the nearest outlet, next, slide the bar off the top and hold a paper bag over the opening, then turn the switch to "On" while still holding the bag. Don't use this method if the bag is full — of course, it should never be half full. Empty once a week.
  8. The paper filter of the bagless vacuum cleaner should be renewed frequently and dusted out at this time with a damp cloth.
  9. To keep the cord in good condition wipe it with a damp cloth every month or so. Then, too, wind loosely in a figure 8 around the bars instead of round and round them for a change. Never vacuum or polish over cord. Always disconnect by pulling plug — not the cord.

**REQUESTED RECIPES**  
**Fried Smelts**  
 (Mrs. J. K.)  
 Wipe smelts, split and clean. Remove heads and tails and cut in half-inch slices crosswise. Cut slices into 2-inch pieces. Arrange slices of fish and bacon alternately on skewers. Brush with salad oil, season with salt and pepper, roll in crumbs, fry in deep fat, or bake in oven for 10 mins. at 400 degs. Note: Have a supply of serviettes on hand. Folks will need serviettes to hold each end of the skewer.

**Frogs' Legs**  
 (Mr. T. A.)  
 Cut off frogs' legs and wash in salty water. Sprinkle with salt and pepper, dip in crumbs, beaten egg, and crumbs again, then fry 3 minutes in deep fat (375 degs.) and drain.

**Rice Meat Loaf**  
 (Mrs. C. L.)  
 1/2 cup uncooked rice  
 2 cups chopped cooked meat  
 1/2 cup gravy or stock  
 2 tablespoons fat  
 2 tablespoons flour  
 1/4 teaspoon salt  
 3 tablespoons chili sauce  
 1 tablespoon chopped onion  
 Tomato sauce  
 Boil rice in salted water. Mix meat with gravy or stock and salt. Add flour and butter creamed together. Heat to boiling point, add chili sauce and onion. Spread half the boiled rice in well-greased loaf pan, over this spread meat mixture, cover with remainder of rice, and press it down firmly. Steam for 40 minutes. Turn out on platter and surround with Tomato Sauce.
