—Milton Beauty Salon has received a new coat of paint.

—Milton Inn and Knight's Men's Wear have recently received brightening coats of paint.

—Many from town and the surrounding district attended the opening of Halton Centennial Manor last Sunday afternoon.

—Charges were dismissed against Steve Matiasak in Magistrate's Court Wednesday when he was charged in connection with a recent alleged stabbing.

—Frank G. Stark and Sons, Milton, paid \$425 for a milking Holstein at a recent sale in Oakville. Highest price of the day was \$640 paid for Patricia Rag Apple Keyes.

—Provincial Constable A. McNiven has been transferred to the Oakville detachment of Provincial Police. Const. McNiven was formerly on the Milton county detachment.

—The old Milton town bell was tried in its new location on Tuesday just before dinner. For many it brought to mind a water shanty off in that case it was a false alarm. The bell was lowered from the top tower to the second floor level during recent town hall repairs.

—The glorious twelfth on Saturday—the day the army of William III of England defeated the forces of James II in 1690. The outcome of the battle decided England's supremacy in Ireland for over two centuries. The Boyne is a small river north of Dublin—and of course a small centre in Trafalgar township.

Council Refuses Request for School

Nelson Township Council, by a majority vote at their meeting on Monday, July 7, refused the request of the School Board of School Area No. 1, for the issuance of debentures for the proposed new school on New Street.

"We believe it should be voted on as a money-by-law," the motion, moved and seconded by Councillor William Green and Deputy Reeve Fred Walker, added.

George Readhead appeared before council asking for a grant to the Halton Agricultural Society which was celebrating its 100th anniversary this year. A grant of \$100 was made.

A letter from Ford Rogers, county assessor, notified the council that the County Court of Revision would sit in Nelson on Wednesday, July 9th. The township was notified that the towns of Burlington and Oakville were appealing the decision of the county council. After some discussion it was decided to instruct the solicitor to secure any expert testimony that might be required.

A petition was received and presented by a delegation representing a large percentage of the voters in Nelson who were employed in Hamilton and elsewhere, which made it difficult for them to reach Nelson Township polls by 7 p.m. The petition asked to have the municipal polls open to 9 p.m. for any election. A motion was passed that the council proceed with the preparation of a by-law regulating the hours of voting to be from 9 a.m. till 9 p.m. and that the previous by-law be rescinded.

Allan Wright was spokesman for a deputation from No. 2 Highway east of the Appleby Line, protesting against the noise attendant on Sunday picnics being held in that area at a tourist camp. "There is a band and the music is foreign to any type we're accustomed to, and it is amplified so it can be heard 1,000 feet away," Mr. Wright asked council to put an anti-noise by-law into effect, and to licence P.A. systems. Council decided to consult the solicitor regarding an anti-noise by-law and that similar by-laws in other municipalities be examined.

The relief account for June of \$262 was passed. The road account of \$10,748.08 was also passed. Two fire calls at \$25 each, and one distress call at \$25 from the Burlington Fire Department, were paid. George Coverdale, R.R. 3, Campbellville, was paid \$10 for killing two dogs worrying sheep. Merle Gunby, R.R. 1, Millgrove, and Jack King, R.R. 2, Milton, were each paid \$5 fox bounty.

Zimmerman Group At Board Meeting

At a special meeting of the school board of School Area No. 1, Nelson Township, on July 4, the board decided to ask the township council to issue debentures for \$305,000 for the proposed new school on New Street.

The board received a deputation from Zimmerman, headed by Marshall Campbell, asking that when the new school is built at Lowville, that provision be made to take care of the pupils from the Zimmerman area. It was stated that full consideration was being given to provide adequate accommodation for those desiring it.

Representatives from Tucks, Bells Cedar Springs and Mount Nemo have asked the same concession.
