### Time Loss Drops In November-Minister

Time loss through work stoppages arising from industrial disputes in Canada during November, 1952, declined sharply from the preceding month and was the lowest for any month during 1952, according to a preliminary summary of strikes and lockouts, released by Hon. Milton F. Gregg,

Minister of Labor. Preliminary figures showed 22 strikes and lockouts in existence during November, 1952, involving 5.084 workers with a time loss of 44,176 man-working days, as compared with 38 work stoppages in October, 1952, with 13,3 workers involved and a time loss of 165,009 man-working days.
