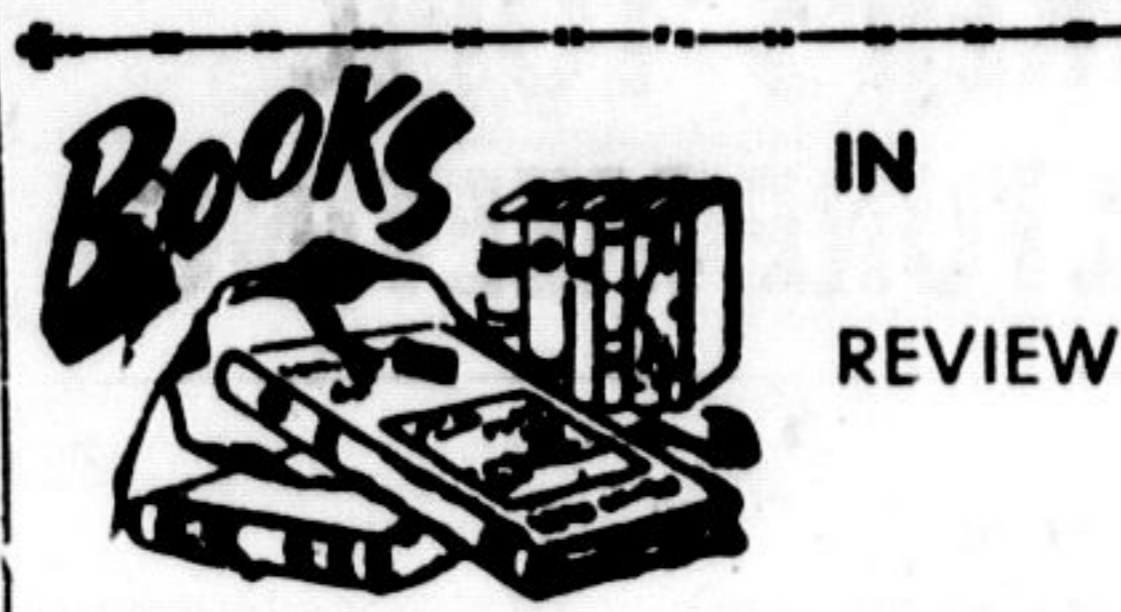


RUBBER FACT

THE CREST OF THE BROKEN WAVE
 by James Barke

Paging Robbie Burns lovers! Here's another in the series, just recently arrived in Milton library. Already published are The Wind that Shakes the Barley, the Song in the Green Thorn Tree, the Wonder of All the Gay World, and now comes The Crest of the Broken Wave. Already in preparation is the next book on Burns' life, The Well of the Silent Harp. These novels will then form the whole work to be called Immortal Memory.

This part of the poet's story is called his Ellisland period, from 1788 to 1791. He was riding the crest of the wave and the wave broke under him. Sharing amorous honors with his wife at this stage of Burns' amorous as well as poetic career was pub attendant Ann Park.

Ratepayers Again Petition Council

Nelson Township Council again said "no" to a deputation of ratepayers from two school sections in the township who petitioned for legislation to enable them to secede from School Area One, Nelson Township.

At the meeting of council held last week, Reeve R. C. Smale had the township clerk, William K. Sims, read a motion passed at a previous special meeting on May 4, which ruling was still in effect. Due to the fact that the percentage of eligible voters in the former school sections of Tuck's and Kilbride, who had petitioned for separation from School Area One, was not sufficient, the council ruled that until such time as the provincial Department of Education recommends such separation, action on these petitions would be deferred.

Lloyd Vivian headed a deputation from Tuck's, and Davis Nicholson was the spokesman for Kilbride. Reeve Smale drew the attention of these people to a petition which had been received from Mrs. W. R. Weir and others, bearing 43 names which had asked that the school sections be kept within the school area.

Mr. Vivian suggested there might be a few irregularities in the counter-petition, and Mr. Nicholson asked permission to check the names of those from Kilbride, with the clerk. Mr. Vivian asked council to check the signatures. Reeve R. C. Smale pointed out that about 40 per cent of eligible voters from Tuck's had supported the petition to secede, and in Kilbride there had been 53 per cent. When the former motion was read, and comment closed, the deputations filed from the room.

A by-law was passed to appoint John Lettner as chief assessor from April 29. A by-law was passed to regulate the planting of trees and hedges and encumbering highways. Under the terms it would be necessary to get a permit from the road engineer before planting any trees or a hedge.

A by-law was read designating through highways. The by-law will not become effective until approved by the Department of Highways, and until signs have been erected and are on display in compliance with the regulations of the department.

P. A. Fisher, chairman of the Inter-Urban Area Board of Burlington-Nelson, with M. H. Armstrong, Allan Thorpe, members of the board, and J. C. Higbee, engineer, presented a construction by-law to the council to provide for the construction of a 36-inch intake extending 2,500 feet out into Lake Ontario, for the enlargement of the waterworks system. The board had allocated half the cost to the Town of Burlington. The by-law was for the construction of the whole and will also be presented to the Burlington council for similar action. Nelson gave the by-law two readings and it is to be presented to the Ontario Municipal Board for approval. A few days ago the water area board accepted the tender of the Russell Construction Company as being the lowest tender, for \$172,602 for the intake.

During the discussion on water problems and routes to be taken to serve the area, Mr. Fisher said the new extension when completed would mean that the system could take care of 60,000 people.
