ECONOMIST SPEAKS TO HORNBY GIRLS

The third meeting of the East Hornby Girls' Garden Club was held at the home of their assistant leader, Mrs. Frank Chisholm, on Tuesday evening, August 4, with all members present but one.

The girls were pleased and fortunate to have with them on this occasion, their Home Economist, Mrs. Mable Borgstrom, who very ably outlined and demonstrated the technique of flower arrangement. She stressed the importance of placing the heavier and the larger blossoms and those of darker shades, at the base of the container and creating an ascending and irregular pattern of different shades to the top where the buds and light colored flowers were placed to complete the appearance of uniformity and balance of the bouquet.

Topics for the reference files to be displayed on Garden Achievement Day, by the senior members, were outlined by the leader, Mrs. Delbert Downs, after which a review was taken of the planting cultivation and care of the garden including definitions and examples of annuals, biennials and perennials.

The girls devoted the remainder of their time to the arrangement of the flowers brought as a roll call by the individual members.

Lunch was competently served by the hostess, assisted by her son, Master Donnie Chisholm, after which the meeting adjourned to meet again on the evening of Friday, August 14 at the home of the leader, Mrs. Delbert Downs.
