

**Tips on Touring**

You can minimize, or even entirely eliminate, eye strain and fatigue suffered on long trips with these three rules:

(1) Keep the windshield spotless—even to the point of cleaning it four or five times a day on long trips. Specks of dust, almost invisible to the naked eye, are always present on the windshield and they distort and reflect rays of sunlight and the glare of oncoming cars at night. Such distortion is inevitably tiring on a long trip.

(2) Eye glasses, like windshields, collect an amazing amount of nearly invisible dust and the wise driver will wipe his glasses frequently, every half hour or so. Wear light colored sun glasses if the sun or snow glare is especially strong—and keep them clean.

(3) Rest your eyes frequently with glances to the sides of the road, but far enough ahead so that objects do not flash past in quick confusion. And take it easy with a trick of veteran truckers and salesmen who drive every day for long periods; they take a five-minute break every hour on the hour.

With these rules and a little common sense you will have little or no eye strain from driving—no matter how long the trip.

**Much Can Be Done To Ease Hay Fever**

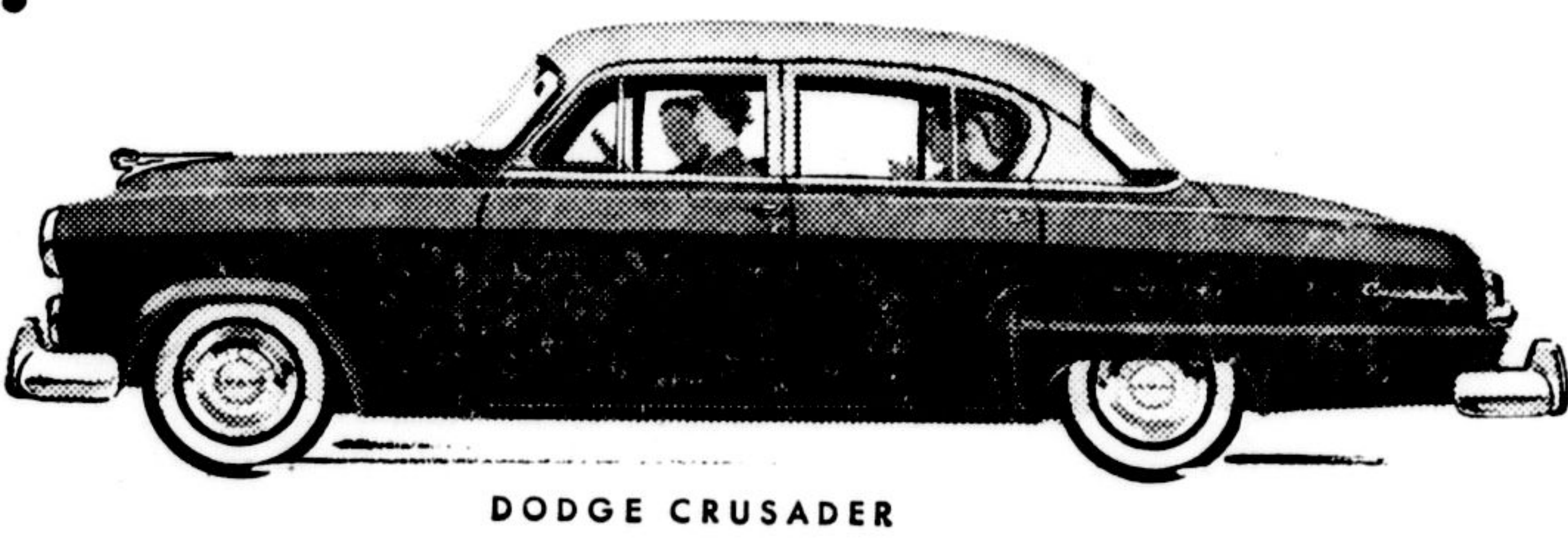
Since hay fever, unless it is treated by injections, is apt to last 10 or 20 years and even longer, with asthma always prone to appear, early medical treatment of the condition is worthwhile, notes Dr. C. Collins-Williams.

"During the first season of hay fever, a child is usually thought to be suffering from a cold," the Toronto paediatrician explains. "However, the symptoms do not respond to the usual treatment for a cold and when this same type of 'cold' develops at the same season of the next year the true diagnosis usually becomes apparent."

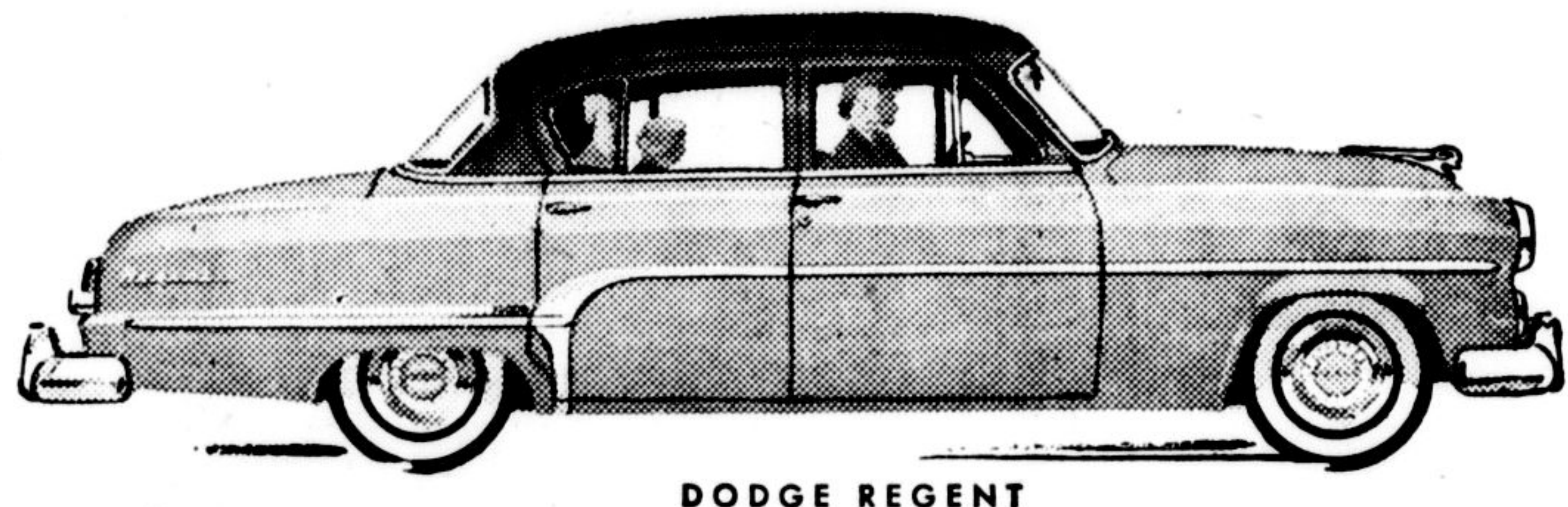
If hay fever is treated only by drugs capable of giving temporary relief, the patient has about a 50 per cent. chance of developing asthma later. To give permanent relief, the substances which are responsible for his symptoms and then must receive injections of minute amounts of these substances in order to build up immunity to them.

Some physicians prefer to give these injections for several months before the "season" each year, others to give them the year round. Whichever method is adopted, it takes a few years to obtain complete relief of symptoms, though partial relief should be noted the first season.

"If you have an allergic child, do not be discouraged," concludes Dr. Collins-Williams. "Whatever allergy he suffers from, a great deal can be done to help him. There is a good chance that he can be given such complete relief that he can lead a normal or almost normal life. If he does not do this well, at least he can be helped a great deal."

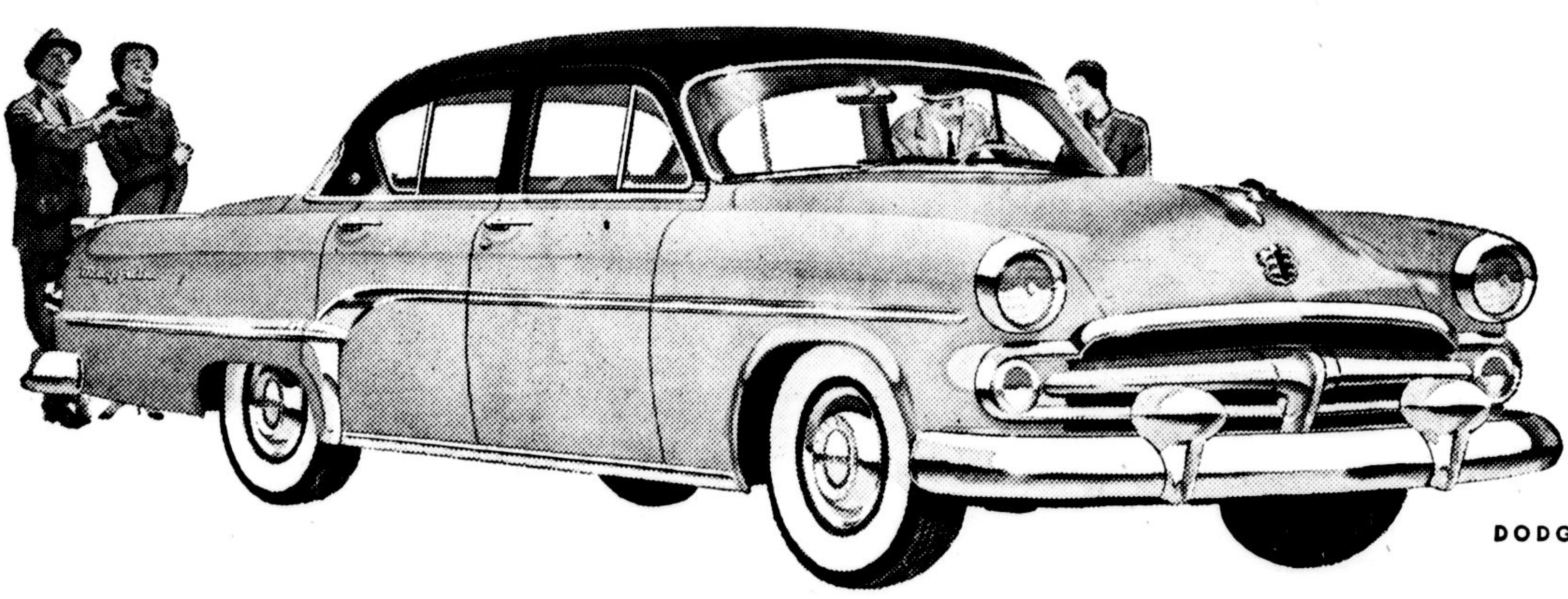


