The importance of assistance offered veterans by the Service Officer was emphasized by Bert Allen in a short talk to members at the regular meeting last Monday night. He said his office welcomed veterans to inquire about ironing out their difficulties, and that no problem was too small for consideration. Continuing, he added the older veterans valued the service his office performed, but the younger men seemed to hesitate in asking assistance. "Regardless of what your problem is do not hesitate to seek our advice, whether it is regarding pensions or other phases in a veteran's life. Give me the full particulars in each case, and I can assure, whatever is parted will be kept in strict confidence," he declared adding it sometimes took considerable time to iron out the problem with the government officials. Comrade secretary again announced the showing of a moving picture, "The Battle of Britain" at Legion Hall next Monday night. He invited all veterans to be present on this occasion. FOOD GIFTS TO BRITAIN 34,000 tons of gift foods have been received in Britain from the Commonwealth and Empire in the three years ending December last. This was announced by the Minister of Food, Mr. Strarhey, in the House of Commons recently. This figure is exclusive of 50 millions gift parcels sent to individuals. The food was sent general distribution to the people most in need. More than 1,900 hospitals, 2,500 charitable institutions and 1,800 schools have benefitted.
