Lesser Plant Food Not Often Needed

What is the value to the farmer of the lesser plant food content of a particular mixed fertilizer in addition to the nitrogen, phosphoric acid and potash? It would be wise to consult the county agricultural representative, or the soil authorities of an agricultural college and university, before paying a larger price for fertilizer claimed to contain lesser plant foods. It may be found that the extra cost is unnecessary. Most of the mixed fertilizers sold in Canada contain in addition to nitrogen, phosphoric acid and potash, some magnesium, calcium and sulphur and traces of the other elements. They contain calcium and sulphur because the superphosphate used in mixed fertilizers is a mixture of calcium sulphate and calcium phosphate which in addition to supplying phosphoric acid supplies both calcium and some sulphur. Most mixed fertilizers contain also some dolomite limestone as filler and this supplies both calcium and magnesium. Farmers have been getting mixed fertilizers containing these lesser plant foods for a long time without even being told about it.

Special kinds of lesser plant foods such as boron and manganese are needed only under very special conditions and may damage crops seriously if not used as prescribed by recognized authorities on their use.

U.K. POTATO FLOUR

The British Ministry of Food is buying from farmers large quantities of potatoes to be dehydrated and used as feed for livestock. The potatoes are coming from areas where the crop is of low quality and the protein content of the flour is between 8 and 9 per cent. Nine sugar beet factories, having a weekly processing capacity of 12 thousand long tons, are dehydrating the potatoes.

To the Electors of Halton:

In my letter of last week I stated that this week I would discuss the question of the possibility of a stalemate with no party having an overall majority. I purposely postponed the discussion of this point knowing that in the meantime you would have the result of the Newfoundland elections as a guide.

On the Saturday preceding these elections Mr. Drew announced at a meeting in British Columbia that his was the only party that could possibly secure an overall majority. Perhaps he intended this statement as a final attraction to the Newfoundland voters just as they were going to vote. Perhaps it was just bad timing on his part.

The Newfoundland vote is now past history. The Liberal party had an overwhelming majority. Five of the Conservatives candidates even lost their deposits in two party contests. Mr. Drew's promises to give them a better deal on confederation, his promises about cheap hydro power, and his special promises to the fishing industry were apparently assessed at their true value instead of face value.

If when June 27th comes the remainder of Canada pay as little attention to empty promises as did the folk of Newfoundland Mr. Drew's prediction of a Conservative victory would appear to be wishful thinking.

There is however some danger of a stalemate unless the Liberals do well in Ontario. The uncertain factor is the Province of Quebec. Newfoundland has proven beyond all doubt that the Conservatives cannot win an overall majority and the Nova Scotia provincial elections which are to be held soon will doubtless confirm this viewpoint. Should the Liberal party suffer heavy losses in Quebec the Liberal party too will be without a working majority. During the past week Mr. J. M. Macdonnell, M.P., one of the leading Ontario Conservative members made a very startling statement in regard to Quebec and one which the Ontario voters should seriously ponder. He was speaking for the record and at Hon. Earl Rowe's nomination. The following I quote from his speech which appeared in *The Globe and Mail* of June 2nd:

"The Union Nationale is merely the old Conservative party in Quebec with a new name. They won over 80 seats out of 90 in the last provincial election and the same people and the same platform are present in this election."

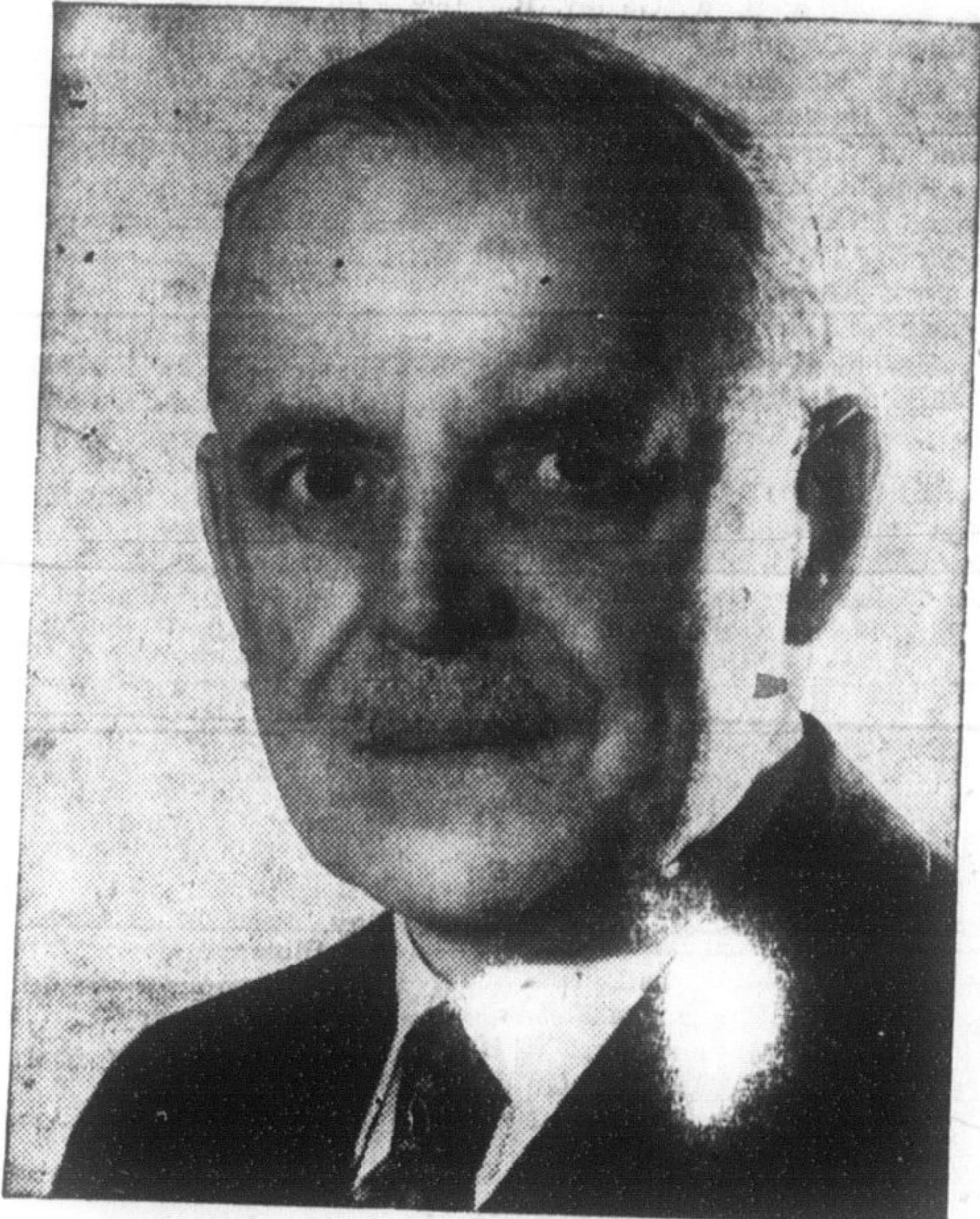
Those words are in quotation marks in the *Globe and Mail* report. We all know that the Union Nationale party in Quebec had a platform opposed to the war, opposed to the Atlantic Pact and opposed to the gifts to Britain. Their election material on these three points was used to inflame the electors and their election of eighty members out of 90 was on an anti-British platform. Now we are told that these anti-British Quebecers are really Conservatives under a different name and that the platform of the Union Nationale is the same platform as the Conservative platform. The anti-British voters in Quebec won out in the Provincial elections and they do not like the stand of the Rt. Hon. Louis St. Laurent but in this campaign their arguments will be answered. Instead of helping to combat this almost subversive agitation in Quebec we find Conservative leaders accepting Union Nationale support and glowing in the fact. I think the Ontario voters will weigh this matter carefully.

Up until the middle of the week we heard a lot about the loss of foreign markets. During the first three months of the year our export trade was down slightly when compared with the first three months of 1948. The April trade figures have now been released and since then we have not a word from our Conservative friends about trade. The April figures bring up our total export trade for the first four months of this year to a total of ten millions in excess of the same period in 1948.

In my canvass during the week I find that some of my farmers have been told that there will be no market next year for eggs and butter. While anyone even at election times should take a delight in gloating over troubles that have not yet reached us is a mystery to me. It is only a matter of common sense to make provision in advance to take care of such problems and your Liberal party has done that. Under our Agricultural Products Act authority is given to maintain a floor price for all types of farm products. In the past the Liberal government has not hesitated to use this power and I want to assure the farmers of my county that so long as the Liberal party is in office reasonable steps will be taken to cope with any emergencies as they arise.
