U. K. LIVESTOCK
 All kinds of livestock in the United Kingdom, except horses, showed an increase in March, 1949, compared with the numbers a year previously. Horses declined from 529,000 to 466,000.
 Pigs gained by 672,000 head, and sheep, with an increase of 615,000 over 1948, shows signs of recovery from the disastrous losses due to the severe winter of 1946-47. The total cattle population this year is greater by 291,000 head.

Signs warning motorists that speed testing devices are in operation in Oakville will be posted conspicuously at all three entrances to the town, council decided Monday night following a lengthy discussion of ways and means to curb speeding on main thoroughfares. Suggesting that the signs would act as a "strong deterrent," Councillor Robert Freeman declared: "Our job is not to catch people, but to cut down the speeding."

Hon. Dana Porter, Ontario's minister of education, unveiled the foundation stone of the new Oakville - Trafalgar High School addition Monday afternoon in the presence of members of the area board, students, and a number of citizens.

A country club featuring swimming as its chief activity is being formed by Thomas Armstrong, Trafalgar Township. It will be known as the Trafalgar Country Swimming Club and will be located on Windy Range farm, at the Dundas highway and the Sixteen-Mile Creek. Surveyors and engineers have been busy making preparations for getting the attractive property into shape and installing swimming pools.

Mrs. Ethel Brown, commercial representative of the local branch of the Bell Telephone Company, retired on Tuesday after 20 years of service with the company. — *Trafalgar Journal.*

PROGRESS ON ACE ELECTRONIC BRAIN

The latest techniques in the development of the Ace, the British Electronic "Brain", were shown to the public recently at the National Physical Laboratory at Teddington. This high-speed computing machine is claimed to be 1,000 times faster than any other calculating machine yet constructed. It contains numbers up to thousands of millions represented as a sequence of powers of two. The digits are translated into electrical pulses about one-third of one-millionth of a second in length and about one-millionth of a second apart.



MISS SYBIL BENNETT

Recently in this space was sketched briefly something of the background of Miss Sybil Bennett, K.C., who is running as the Progressive Conservative candidate for Halton in the June 27th Federal Election.

Knowledge of the background of the candidate is necessary but even more important is to know what she believes a government should do, and what she believes her fellow citizens want and need.

It is Miss Bennett's firm conviction that a government should make and administer the law and regulate and guide the business of the people.

"I use the words 'guide' and 'regulate' advisedly," Miss Bennett says, "for I believe that we should be allowed as much as possible to lead our own lives without constant government interference."

"Compulsion and choking controls have no place in a democracy," Miss Bennett asserts, too, that a government should at all times maintain the supremacy of Parliament and see that laws are made only after full and free discussion on the floor of the House of Commons. Never, she adds, should a country be ruled by orders-in-council, by boards, commissions or bureaucrats.

During the regime of the Liberal government, she points out, orders-in-council were used more and more often resorted to, and now, four years after the war, this practice is still in wide use.

Laws are put into effect without the consent of the people having a chance to defeat them if it is felt that these regulations are not good, she adds.

"As for the socialists who are seeking power," Miss Bennett warns "the state more than ever must interfere in the private lives of Canadians. No field of activity, be it agriculture, labour or business, would be safe from the prying fingers of government, from the grasping clutch of bureaucrats."

A government should give and maintain the greatest amount of freedom and liberty in all phases of the life of its citizens," Miss Bennett continues, "but at all times this freedom must be consistent with the good and welfare of the people as a whole. In other words, freedom should not be confused with license."

"There must be free enterprise with full opportunity for the greatest individual development possible, but there must be protection against monopoly and unfair competition. This is the only sound basis for personal liberty."

Miss Bennett also takes exception to the growing practice of a government being divorced from its citizens, the people who are, in actuality, the government itself.

A government must be close to those it represents, it must know the needs of those it governs, it must know what people want, socially, economically, and morally. And it must never act for one class of society to the exclusion of any other class.

The Halton Progressive Conservative candidate also feels strongly about the need for foreign trade and the importance of using Canada's natural resources to the full.

These natural resources must be developed and preserved by the government, she says, in order to guarantee full and continuous pay envelopes, a better and better standard of living.

She points out that Canada's resources are not enough, however, if at the same time foreign trade is allowed to continue falling as it is at the present moment.

Without foreign markets for surplus products this country must inevitably meet depression times, for three out of every eight persons in the Dominion live from the revenue of products sold abroad.

In addition, Miss Bennett believes the government must encourage and help men and women to establish their own small businesses or farms for it is through such initiative and independence that a country becomes strong and prosperous.

The Progressive Conservative government would give pensions at the age of 65 without a means test. Miss Bennett says, and it would provide accident, sickness and disability benefits. In addition the party is pledged to bring in a health insurance plan, including medical and hospital care. It would give extended unemployment insurance and it would take a direct hand in housing, home ownership and reduced housing costs.

"These basic needs would be looked after by a Progressive Conservative government," Miss Bennett concludes, "but never would there be tax for mere sake of taxing as is being done now, never would we take billions of dollars from the people over and above the sums needed to run a nation's vital services."

NEW FORM OF AIR TRAFFIC CONTROL

Britain is establishing air corridors ten miles wide. They will form a system of aviation highways at heights of between 5,000 and 11,000 feet. This will ensure safer flying and prevent collisions between aircraft even in poor visibility. Both civil and military planes will be expected to conform to this new form of traffic control. The movement of the aircraft will be organized from ground radio stations which will transmit instructions to the pilot.

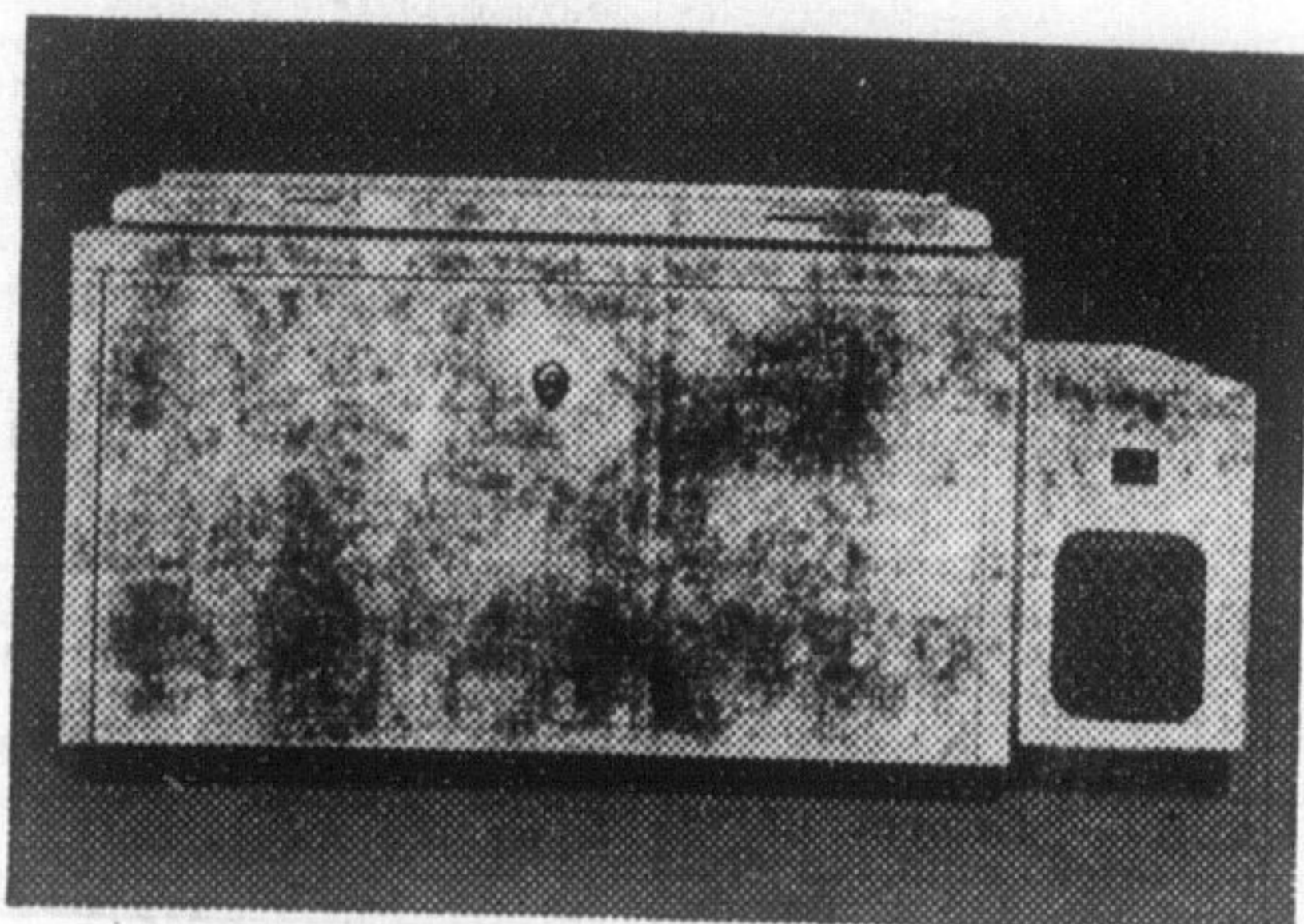

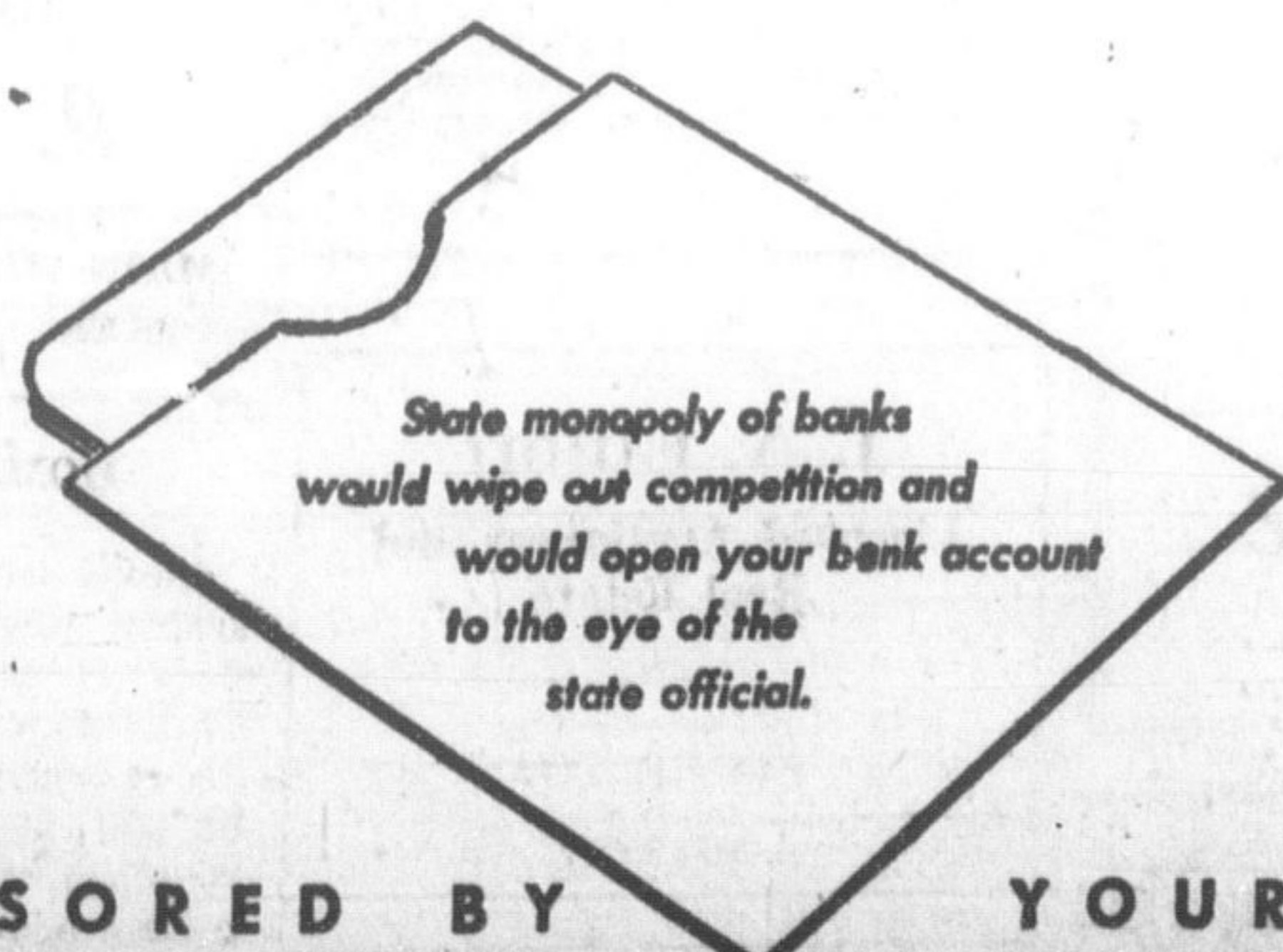
