Typical of Vancouver, Halifax and many another city is Toronto's case. There, applicant waiting lists for apartments in the \$85 to \$150 a month bracket are smaller than a year ago and applicants no longer sign up on a moment's notice.

Montreal area recently has seen significant easing in demand and building volume for smaller and heated apartments.

But almost generally across Canada in the larger and growing communities, effective demand for lower-rent accommodation is easily as great a year ago and building volume at least equal to last year's
