Hello Homemakers! When one becomes interested in frozen food equipment for the home, many questions as to type, size and usefulness of equipment come to mind. If there is a freezing locker plant in the district, you may not have any intention of buying a home freezer. The freezing unit will be your best buy when garden produce, poultry and meats, are available where you live, or at wholesale prices. The home freezer is the type where produce is frozen and kept frozen in a constant temperature of below 10 degs. If the country home owner is interested in selling produce, such as poultry, eggs and fruits, then a zero cabinet or a space rented in the chilling room of a locker plant is advisable.

The decision whether a home freezer will be of value or not depends on how much produce can be grown at home or purchased at wholesale prices and whether you can keep that freezer filled to capacity for practically the year round. The operation is not much more than 2 kilowatt hours a day if the home freezer is kept filled. Defrosting should only be necessary once every 8 or 12 months. At this time the method is simply to disconnect the cabinet at the convenience outlet and remove packages to a well-padded box, then scrape the frost with a dull tool such as a wooden ruler.

TO PREPARE FRUITS FOR FREEZING
1. Fruits are prepared in the same manner as for the table or for other use—sort, wash and drain.
2. Precautions are:
(a) Select varieties recommended by your local agricultural advisor.

THE QUESTION BOX

Mrs. A. H. asks: How can we cook beets in a pressure cooker to keep them a good red colour?

Answer: To cook beets in a pressure saucapan, wash thoroughly, leaving all but one inch of tops and the roots on. Place beets on rack with 1/2 inch water in the pressure saucapan. Adjust cover and allow steam to flow out the vent to release all air, then place on indicator and cook for 10 mins. at 10 lbs pressure. It is necessary that the saucapan be cooled immediately by placing in the sink or in a pan of water filled to one-half its depth. Remove the cover as soon as the pressure is normal and skin beets. Season with salt before serving to maintain deep red colour.

Miss S. R. asks: How to prevent a fresh fruit pie from boiling over?

Answer—Allow 3 cups of fruit for a 7 inch pie and blend together with 2/3 cups sugar, 4 tbsps. lemon juice. Wrap a piece of wet parchment paper along the edge of the filled pie plate and place pie in a preheated oven of 450 degs. for 10 mins. then reduce the heat to 350 degs. for about 30 mins. To reduce the heat we simply move the indicator on an electric oven to 350 and let the temperature fall gradually.

In A Country Lane

A mass gathering of any kind is bound to create some fairly strong impression on the people who make it up. And probably the most inspiring kind of mass gathering is that which takes place under the sponsorship of the church. We attended such a service on Sunday afternoon observing the 25th Anniversary of the United Church of Canada, held in Milton, and found it good to be there.

trees and grass (we won't mention the blowing dust), bright colours of band uniforms and children's clothes, the excellent music, and the atmosphere of worship that prevailed in the environment accustomed to gatherings of a different sort, not to mention the very fine sermon—all these made one wonder if it wouldn't be a good thing to have more out-door services. We know that the Master spoke to the multitudes in the fields, on the hills, and by the sea. Probably by so doing He got the ear of many who would not have listened in the synagogue. Some of the best sermons are preached on street corners by Salvation Army chaplains. And we have no doubt many ministers of orthodox churches would willingly hold more outdoor services if it were an accepted custom. Just recently a drive-in church service has come into being in Ontario. It will be interesting to see just how it turns out. The minister is quoted as saying he believes this is the first such church service in America. However, a friend wintering in Florida last winter told me she had attended a drive-in church service down there in the sunny south. So perhaps this may be the first one in Canada, if not in America.

We felt only one disappointment in connection with the service. We'd like to have listened to the speaker, the Rev. E. Crossley Hunter, for just twice as long as he spoke. Not being one of those people who suffer when sermons are long, we are quite likely to think they are too short. In this connection, we think with some amusement of a friend whose sermons are always on the lengthy side. And although he has been told tactfully, and also bluntly, by the members of his congregation that he is too long-winded he just goes blithely on preaching as long as he likes.

It doesn't hurt them to listen an extra ten minutes," he says. He tells them that, too, and they good-naturedly agree. But some of them fidget and some nod and some good house-wives who left the roast in the oven get quite across wondering if it will be shrunk to half its size.

We often wonder if all these people who do not go to Sunday evening service are appreciating the wonderful service the CBC started broadcasting from Ottawa a few months ago. We happen to be one of those who often wondered indignantly why radio listeners could not have a Sunday evening worship service on our national network. Not being addicted to Charlie McCarthy or any other of the popular Sunday evening entertainers, we just turned off the radio and frowned to ourselves because we had to listen to bunk or nothing. A great many other people were in favour, volubly in favour of a religious period for that time, and it just goes to show what public opinion can do, for eventually one made its appearance. And this service happens to be one that is a real credit to the CBC. We who grouched should now be commending the CBC for instituting so fine a program. Of course we hope that those good people who were in the habit of going to church do not now stay home to listen, for we doubt if it can take the place of one's own service, but we do think it is a good thing that the stay-at-homes have a service to listen to. And one that can actually compete with Charlie McCarthy—or is it some-one else it competes with? We are not very well-informed when it comes to certain programs.

Speaking of radio programs—we wonder if all the women who loathe the popular soap operas were to write in to the sponsors and tell them in no uncertain terms just how much they despise them, if we'd get anything better! Why do these sponsors not put on a program that will teach mothercraft or health practice or some other useful thing in an entertaining way? If women are becoming neurotic, couldn't it be the affects of listening to the soap operas, if they listen? Could be!
